Enclosure Memorandum

30th July 1819.

Sir Edward Thornbrough -

Commanded one of the Frigates of Lord Howe's Squadron on the 1st June, & the Robust in Sir J. Warren's Action in 1798.

Sir George Campbell -

appears to have been, since he was promoted to the rank of Post Captain, in only one action - viz^t Lord Howe's affair in 1795, in which his Ship had no man killed and only seven wounded.

Sir William Domett -

Captain of the Royal George in the Battle of the 1st of June, in which she had 20 men killed, & 72 wounded - the Cap^t received the Gold Medal.

Captain of the Royal George in Lord Bridport's action in 1795. - & was selected to bring home the dispatches.

Captain of the Channel Fleet under Lord S^t Vincent in 1799. -

Colonel of Marines in 1801. -

Captain of the Fleet at the forcing the passage of the Sound in 1801. -

Captain of the Baltic fleet under Lord Nelson.

Sir William Donnett
(Continued)

Captain of the Channel fleet
under Admiral Cornwallis
till the peace in 1802, and
on the breaking out of the
War again Captain of the
Channel fleet. —

Lord Commissioner of
the Admiralty for 5 years.

Sir Thomas Foley —

Captain of the S^t. George
in Lord Rothe's affair
which Ship had 4 killed
& 12 wounded. —

Captain of the
Britannia in the Battle
off S^t. Vincent's, for which
he received the gold medal.

Led the Fleet into the
Battle of the Nile as Captain
of the Goliath, & took his
opponent, for which he
received a second gold medal,
and he is the only Flag Officer
who has two Gold medals. —

Captain of Lord Nelson's
Ship at the battle of
Copenhagen. —
