My Dear Bloomfield,

You will probably remember an
Application made to the Prince Regent some months
ago by the Inhabitants of Windsor for His Royal
Highness's Assistance towards building a new Church here,
and my stating to you the Objections I had made to their
Proposals & Applications on the ground of too extensive
a Plan and their engaging in the Undertaking
without sufficient Means or a probability of obtaining
them & how the Question rested for some time.

I persisted in my Objections. — It has been recently
revised and I am under the necessity of troubling You
with the Correspondence which has passed in consequence
I cannot any longer avoid submitting the Subject
through You to the Prince Regent. — Should
His Royal Highness be graciously pleased to
sanction any Contribution from the King's Burgesses
I would humbly suggest £500 as the proper
Sum, His Majesty having always expressed an
Intention of giving a liberal Aid to such an

Object, as to the Repairs and that being, as far as
I remember, the same approved by the Lion when
the Subject was submitted on a former Occasion.
In the Event of His Royal Highness's now
authorizing such Subscriptions the Benefactors will
subscribe £100 each.

I should however observe that the
Committee obstinately adhere to the Adoption of
a very expensive Plan to the exclusion of others
more reasonable & practicable in opposition to
the Opinion of many who differ with them
and that there appears on this Occasion to be

a Combination of Interests & Speculations of a few
Individuals, which should be ^{checked} ~~and~~ by a General
Meeting of the Inhabitants. It does not appear
even that the Benevolence of repairing the Old
Church has been fairly discussed.
