July 30. 1819. —

Sir,

In conformity with a Resolution of the Committee for Rebuilding the Parish Church I take the liberty, as Chairman of that Committee, of most respectfully stating the progress of the subscription for this object. The Committee, by Public Advertisement, by letters, and by personal application, have obtained answers from the majority of the inhabitants and others from whom subscriptions are expected; a list of which is enclosed, amounting to £3,413. 5. 6. The Society for the Enlargement & Repair of Churches, have delayed an answer to the application of this Committee, alleging that the Society cannot decide upon the extent of assistance, until the inhabitants are prepared to furnish a statement of the total amount of their resources.

The Committee therefore venture

to

to request that you will do them the favour again to submit to the Royal Family their most respectful application for that assistance which the Baron of Widdow has ever received from the Royal Munificence. The Committee are anxious as soon as possible to accede to the wishes of the Society for enlarging Churches, in presenting a complete statement of their expectations. —
