The King's Proclamation, 4 Oct. 1714, whereby G. Geo: 1st signified that he had "resolved
Geo: 1st" "to celebrate the Solemnity of his Coronation", (the Queen
not mentd?) on 20th. October

Coronated 20. Oct. 1714.

arrived in Engl. 17 Sept. 1714

All the directions to the various Officers of State, to make the
necessary preparations, speak only of "His Majesty's Coronation".

The Prince of Wales summoned to attend the Coronation by Letter
from the King himself.

The Mistress of the Robes of the late Queen (Anne) is directed to
report the preparations necessary in that department.
Medals ordered to be struck, with Portrait of the King.

George 2^d. - King's Procl.ⁿ 12. Aug. 1727 signifies, that His Majesty has resolved
to celebrate the Solemnity of his Coronation, & of the Queen's
(of our Royal Coronation, and of the Coronation of
"our dearly beloved Consort the Queen")

The directions to the diff. Officers of State, are, to prepare
for "their Majesties Coronation of their Majesties."

The Queen not summoned, or invited to attend, by Letter from
the King, or otherwise.

The Queen's Mistress of the Robes directed to report the
preparations necessary.

Medals ordered to be struck, with Portraits of their Majesties
exhibited together (in same Medal).

George 3^d. - King's Proclam.ⁿ 8. July 1761 signifies that His Majesty has
resolved to celebrate the Solemnity of his Coronation.

Same Day - The King declared his intention of Marriage.

22 July 1761 - Order to the Earl Marshall to prepare also for
the Coronation of the Queen, also the Procl.ⁿ had only
expressed the King's Coronation

22^d. Sept. 1761 - Day of Coronation of the King & Queen -
(The Marriage of course previous)

Geo: 1st Married the Princess Sophia Dorothea, daughter & heiress of the Duke of Zell, by whom he had K. Geo: 2 and the late Queen of Prussia. Smollett's cont. of Moore's England - Vol: 10. p. 422.

In Sandford's Genealogical Hist^y the foll^wg account given of K. George 1st / Vol: 1

"George Lewis, Prince Electoral of Brunswick Lunenburg, Eldest Son of Ernest Augustus late Elector of Brunswick, by Her Royal Highness the Princess Sophia, was born 28. May 1660. In 1690 he succeeded the Elector his father in his Titles & Dominions. In 1701 he was Elected a Knight of the Garter (13. 15th 3rd). In 1705 upon the death of his Uncle Duke of Zell, he succeeded him in that Duality. 11. Dec^r: 1682 he married at Zell Sophia Dorothea his Cousin German, by whom he hath Issue George August Prince Electoral of Brunswick Lunenburg born 30th Oct^r: 1683, elected K^t: of the Garter 2 April 1706, & 9 Dec^r: after^wd, created Duke of Cambridge. He married in beginning of Sept^r: 1705 the Princess Wilhelmina Carolina, Sister of the Margressis of Ansbach, by whom he hath Issue George Frederick Prince of Brunswick born at Hanover 30 Jan^y 1706 K. S.

Thus King George 1st - Born 28. May 1660 -

Married 11. Dec^r: 1682 to Sophia Dorothea of Zell

Came to the Crown 1. Aug^t: 1714

Died 11. June 1727

Died 1726 according to Betham's Genealogical Table 479 - (only one year before his husband)
