The King is willing to adopt
the Draft of the Speech as
proposed to Him with
the omission of the words
"after so much deliberation"
in the paragraph which
relates to the Civil List.

The King is fully sensible
of the importance of pub-
lic economy and is de-
-sirous to make every pres-
-ent sacrifice on his part
for that object, and the
King will never require
that the intended ar-
-rangement

shall be disturbed, unless
it shall be found to be
inconsistent with the
dignity and splendour of
the Crown which she
considers
to be inseparable
from the public interest.
