Dear Sir

In answer to your note of the 10th Inst. communicating to me His Majesty's desire of learning what Duplicates of works are now contained in the Royal Library at Buckingham House; I have the honor to send you enclosed, a list of all that are there at present; & I beg leave to add, for His Majesty's information, that the reason there are so few, is, that in the year 1813, all the Duplicate Books that had been accumulating from various circumstances for several years, were at that time disposed of to Mr Nicol. Bookseller to His Late Majesty, & the amount expended upon

other publications. I beg leave to add, that
there is also a ^{divine} Selection of Books, forming a
complete Library, which was removed from
Windsor Great Lodge. & few Books of common use,
which were taken from Weymouth, ^{now} at the
Royal Palace Buckingham House.

Of the Windsor Library there is perfect & complete
Catalogue made & digested by myself.
