I have the honor to state that agreeably to your order I have had an interview with Mr. Roberts to ask what rent he would require from His Majesty for the Premises occupied by me as Keeper of His Majesty's Private Barge, in the event of its being the King's intention to retain them, after the expiration of His Majesty's Lease on the 3<sup>d</sup> of June next: and have to report, that the sum asked by him, is sixty pounds per annum. The Taxes for last year were £10. 17. 3 the Premises being only rated at £30 in the Parish Books
