Mr. Hancock has received a letter which we have permission to transcribe :—

Carlton House, 10th July, 1826.

SIR,—I am commanded to acquaint you, that the King has been graciously pleased to comply with your desire, and to accept the Cabinet, prepared by you and forwarded to Carlton House, for the purpose of being presented to his Majesty

His Majesty is gratified with your dutiful attention, and has further commanded me to transmit to you a draft (which I enclose) for one hundred guineas, as a mark of his Majesty's gracious approbation,
