I address you in con-

I will give them directions  
to give up the Bill for £ 72. 17  
which I endorsed, and  
my cheque for £ 14. 10. 6  
to the Messrs Cameron, to the  
person who pays the above  
sum to my account, which  
will be your Vouchers -  
Lady Ravensworth and  
myself are greatly distressed

at the late unsatisfactory  
accounts of the King's health,  
and could you afford us  
a gleam of comfort on  
this heart-breaking subject,  
it would be esteemed by  
both of us, not only as a  
great obligation, but as  
the greatest gratification  
you could bestow.
