Dear Sir William.

I address you in consequence of having been directed so to do, to inform you that the Books forwarded from Brussels which I have procured for His Majesty, has been safely delivered some days ago to Mr. Jutslam in Pall Mall, under whose charge they are now placed.

I have also discharged all the expenses of the original —

original purchase, the
packing and putting on
board ship at Brussels,
and the charges of freight
and landing, castafe &c.
to Pall Mall by Messrs
F. & J. Cazenove & Co in
the City.

The amount of the bill
drawn upon me from
Brussels is £172: 17:
and Mess^r. Cazenoves
account for freight &
landing £14: 10. 6. both
of which I have paid, and

Shall be obliged by your
 giving directions that the
 sum of £ 487. 7. 6 may be
 paid to my account
 at my Bankers, Messrs. Snow,
 Paul, & Co. 217. Strand.

I will give them directions
 to give up the Bill for £ 192. 17
 which I endorsed, and
 my oblige for £ 14. 10. 6
 to the Messrs. Gazmore, to the
 person who pays the above
 sum to my account, which
 will be your Vouchers -
 Lady Rawesworth and
 myself are greatly distressed

at the late unsatisfactory
accounts of the King's health,
and could you afford us
a gleam of comfort on
this heart-breaking subject,
it would be esteemed by
both of us, not only as a
great obligation, but as
the greatest gratification
you could bestow.
