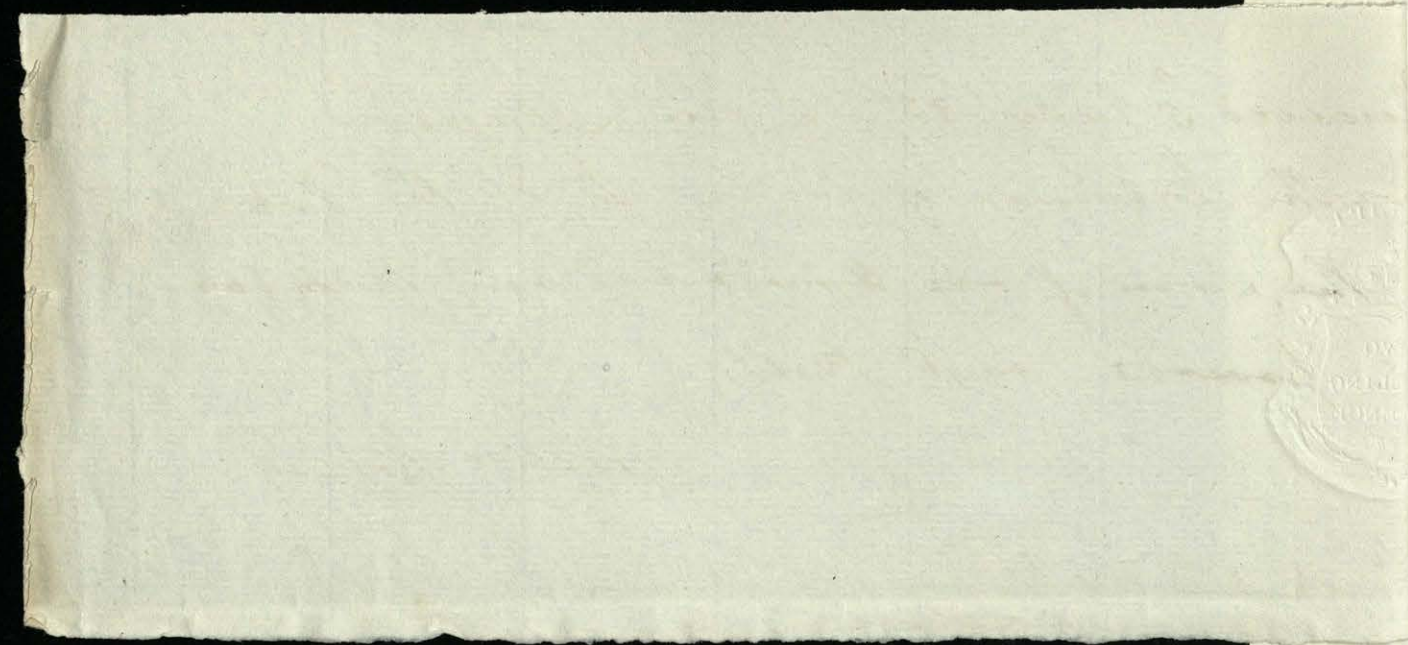

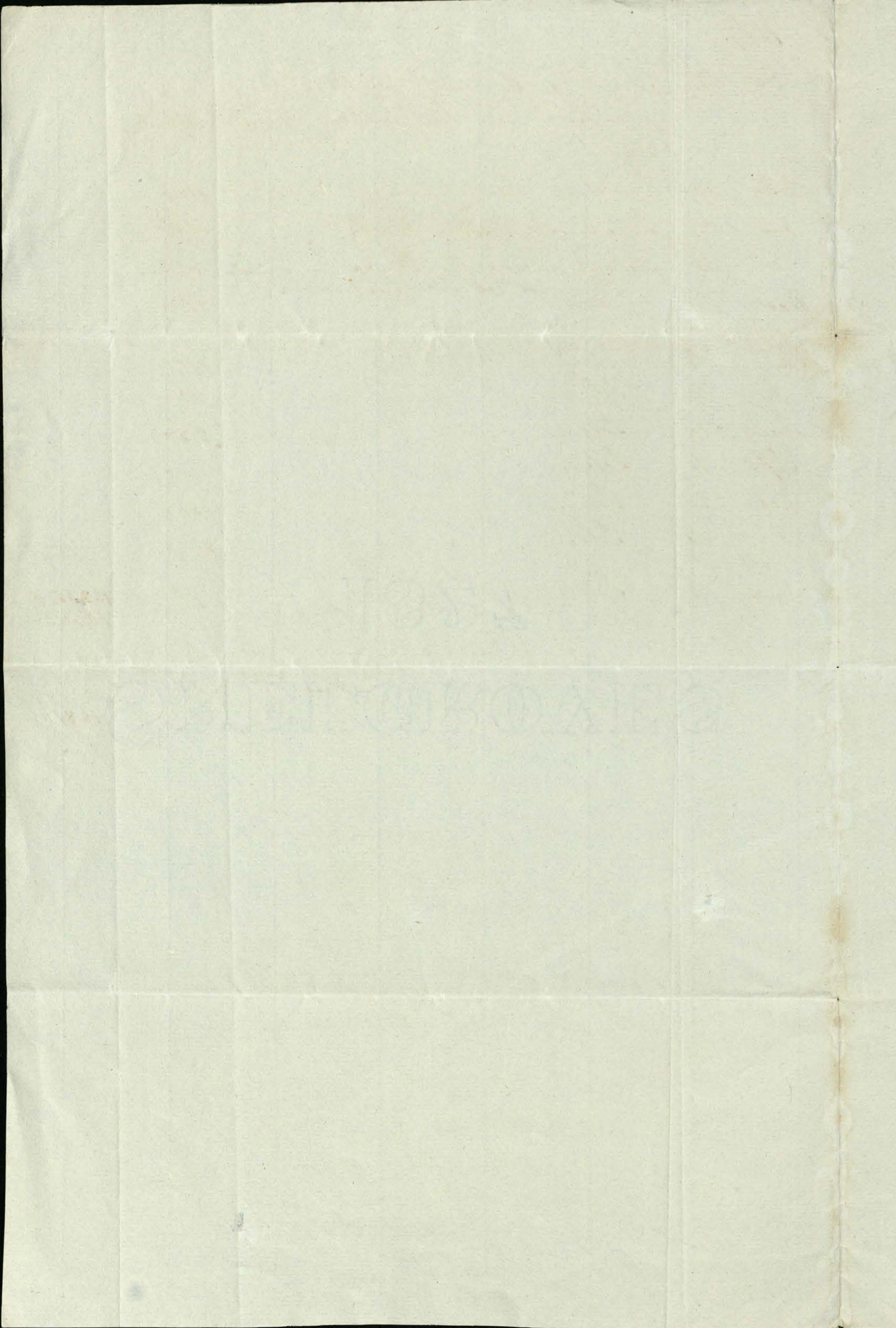

I have to crave your pardon for having delayed so long to furnish you with the Estimate which you required of the annual expense of a Breeding Establishment upon the scale mentioned by you, some time ago. I have stated the question (as if for my own private information) to several competent persons, and have invariably received for answer "that so much depended upon the situation of the premises, whether the party was owner or rented them, whether he grew his own corn, &c. &c. that it was difficult to form any accurate idea upon the subject" - and in reply to a letter addressed to a person absolutely a Breeder I have as follows: "I should have answered your letter sooner, but wishing to give your request every due consideration" "which I have done and found so much difficulty" "in giving an estimate on the subject that I hope" "to be excused" - Not however discouraged by these circumstances, and most anxious to obey your commands, I have Sir, ventured to form an opinion of my own (a very humble and probably an erroneous one) and in so doing I have discarded all considerations of the above contingencies, and have taken it upon the supposition that you would buy every thing, at an average market price: observing however, that if you produced your own commodities, the expenses would



would be a little diminished, but not much so, for if  
you buy at a market price, your own produce, is worth
