 residing ^{at present} N^o. 18, Place Vendome, in the City of Paris.

Humbly Sheweth,

That Monsieur Pierre Claude Lepine, of N^o. 12 & 20, Place des Victoires, in the City of Paris, Clock-maker, made to the order of Your Majesty two superb Clocks, of which the Memorialist begs to inclose the description as given in the French Language by the said Monsieur Lepine, which were accordingly delivered to Your Majesty in the year 1790, and are now in your Majesty's Palace.

That the Invoice, amounting to Three thousand two hundred and fifty pounds, was forwarded to Mess^{rs}. Merland Ranson & Hammersley Bankers in London, who received on behalf of the said Monsieur Lepine and on account of the amount due on the said Clocks, two payments amounting together to Four hundred pounds.

That the events of the French Revolution having soon after stopped every communication between this Kingdom and France Monsieur Lepine found himself in the utter impossibility of preserving his Claim before the Commissioners appointed for the settlement of your Majesty's Accounts.

That the nonpayment of such a large sum of money being exceedingly inconvenient to Monsieur Lepine in his Trade, he was on a Settlement of Accounts under the necessity of transferring this Claim to Monsieur Jean Baptiste Hosten of N^o. 34, rue St. George in the City of Paris.

That by a certain Instrument dated the 8th day of June 1798 the said Pierre Claude Lepine assigned all his right and interest in the said sum of £2850 remaining due to him to M^r. Francois Prevost of Hamburg; that such Assignment was made to the said Francois Prevost as Trustee only for the said Jean Baptiste Hosten by reason that had it been discovered by the then existing Authorities in France, that the

said Jean Baptiste Hosten, (who was a Frenchman) had any dealings with English Property, his Life would have been endangered.

That the Representatives of the said Francois Prevost are aware of this fact and concur with your Memorialist.

That the said Monsieur Jean Baptiste Hosten during the short Peace of 1802, caused application to be made for the payment of the balance due to him, as the Representative of Monsieur Sepine; but War being shortly after declared between England and France, he was unable to further his claim.

That Monsieur Hosten having died in Paris, your Memorialist, who had married his only daughter and heirs, administered to his effects.

But that Monsieur Hosten having left his affairs in a rather embarrasped state, it was only lately your Memorialist was put in possession of the above mentioned facts.

That your Memorialist hopes therefore that, considering the unfortunate circumstances which have prevented his bringing his Claim sooner forward, Your Majesty will deign to take it into your gracious consideration; and that your Majesty will direct an Enquiry to be made into the particulars of your Memorialist's claims, and payment to be made of the sum due to him.
