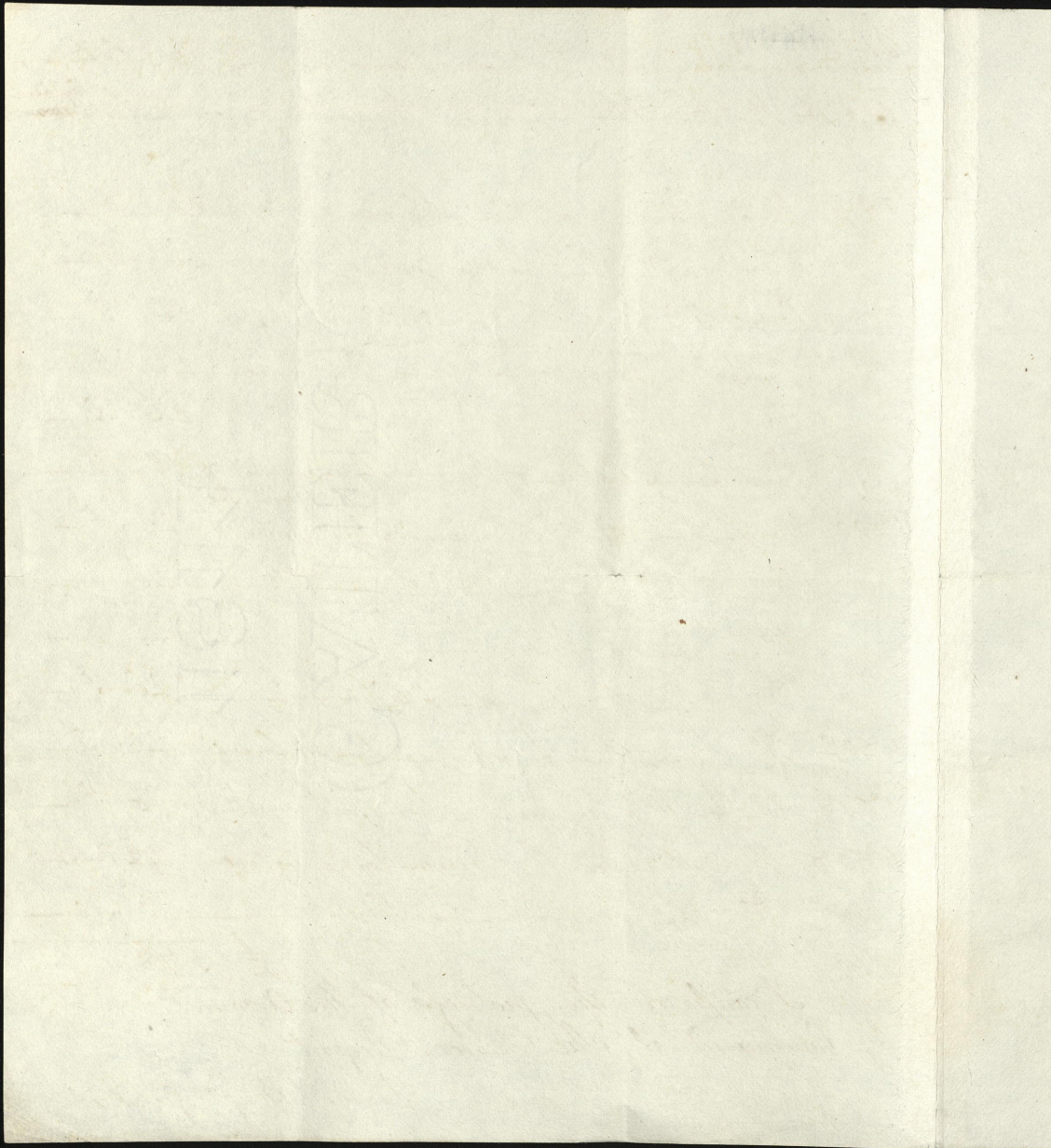


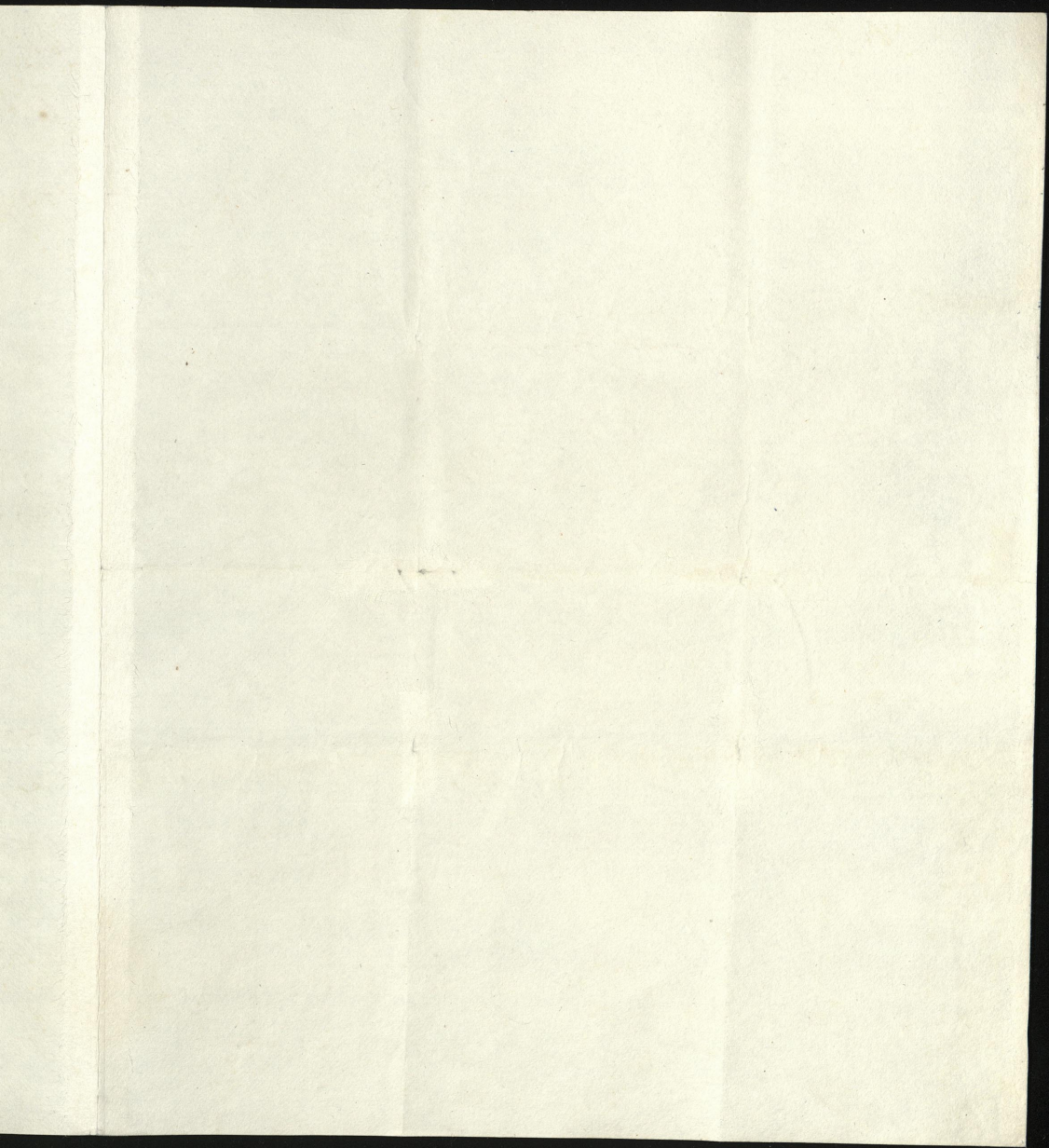

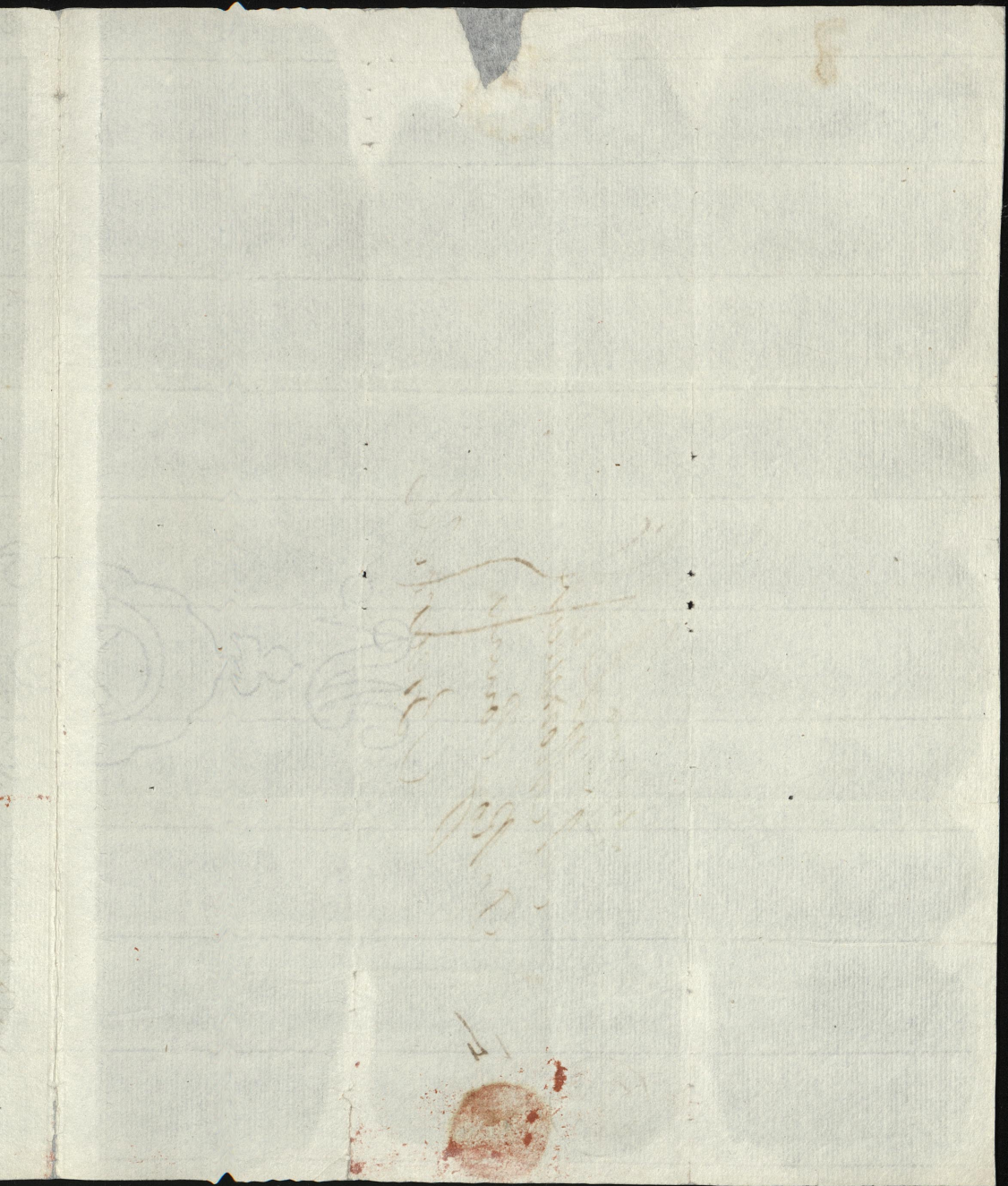

I am authorised by M^r. De Roy, Louis of Brussels, to address myself to you for the purpose of claiming £7. 2. 0 being the amount of Duty and Charges upon a Painting, which the same commissioned M^r. Mitchell of this City, to offer in his name to His present Majesty, then Prince Regent, which His Majesty was graciously pleased to notify his acceptance of thro' you, in a letter from the Pavillon, bearing date, Jan. 23. 1816, now in my possession with all the papers relating to this Transaction. I have the honor to inclose a letter from M^r. Mitchell to M^r. De Roy, by which you will perceive that the latter reimbursed M^r. Mitchell the expenses that had been incurred upon the said Painting.

M^r. De Roy was not aware at the time he did Homage of this Painting to His Royal Highness, the Prince Regent, that it would have been subjected to any Duty; yet he felt himself bound in honor to reimburse M^r. Mitchell the said expenses, notwithstanding the unfortunate position he was then in, and still continues to be, which constrains him, thro'

with great reluctance, to solicit thro' your kind interference for
the reimbursement of the said Duties, which would be most
thankfully received, and gratefully acknowledged.

Sir,

I had the honor of addressing you a letter
on the 30th of Sep^r last, in behalf of M^r. DeLoy Bowit of
Brussels, the object of which was to claim back £7^s 2^d. -
being the amount of Duty and Charges paid in this Country
in 1816. upon a Painting representing a subject connected
with the Battle of Waterloo, which that gentleman had the
honor of presenting to His most gracious Majesty (then
Prince Regent) thro' the medium of M^r. Mitchell, Painter
in London, formerly a Partner of the House of Theleuson
& Brothers, whose letter to M^r. DeLoy, I inclosed to you, at the
same time, announcing thro' your medium His Majesty's
gracious acceptance of the said Painting. M^r. Mitchell
reimbursed himself at the time of the amount of the said
Charges in a bill upon M^r. DeLoy, which he felt, of course,
bound to honor, tho' at the same time he conceived it
must have been owing to some mistake that they should

had been incurred upon any thing intended for His Majesty.
I expressed to you, Sir, the reluctance Mr. Delroy felt
to claim such a trifling sum: but trifling as it is, it would
be most acceptable to him, his having ever since that period
met with an uninterrupted series of misfortunes, which
Circumstances will, I trust, induce His Majesty to order the
restitution of the said Charge, which I should feel most
happy to have it in my power to remit to Mr. Delroy.

I return you the note which you put into my hand yesterday - it alludes to a Painting a representation of La Belle Alliance painted by De Roy of Brussels - he presented it to His Majesty in the Year 1816 - upon which it appears that a Duty was paid to Government by Mr Mitchell of L^o 2^d - Mr De Roy has since that time - become, I understand very poor - and not only wishes to get the amount of the Duties returned - but if I am allowed to judge - from the wording of

of the note now before me & as well as
those which were written last year on
the same subject & I should be lead to
suppose that Mr De Roy expects something
more from the King of England than the
reimbursement of the duties which were
paid for the Picture & I am persuaded from
the humanity which His Majesty is
known to possess & that if His Majesty
know the circumstances of the case & and
the poverty of the individual & that
something like an equivalent to the value
of the Picture would be ordered to be
transmitted to him with a suitable
expression on the occasion & which
would enhance the value of the donation.

Sir

Mr Conway not being able to write himself, has charged me to acknowledge the favour of your note. In answer to your kind request, he wishes you would be so good as to refer to the last payment he received from His Royal Highness, since which time Mr Conway has never applied for what he had finished, having in hand several Pictures for which he waited for His Royal Highness's Commands.

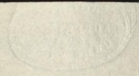
No other reason can be assigned but his Delicacy, neglecting from year to year applying to any body, but more particularly to any part of the Royal Family. An instance may be recently proved concerning Her Late Majesty; Mr Conway thought proper to send in, his Memorandum, and tho' a very trifling sum, the payment has been refused on account of the distant date.

I hope this may be a satisfactory answer to your request, & that you will excuse my having added what I think may still more convince you of the cause of delaying the claim for so long a period, & of the melancholy consequences Mr Conway's experience from his delicacy.

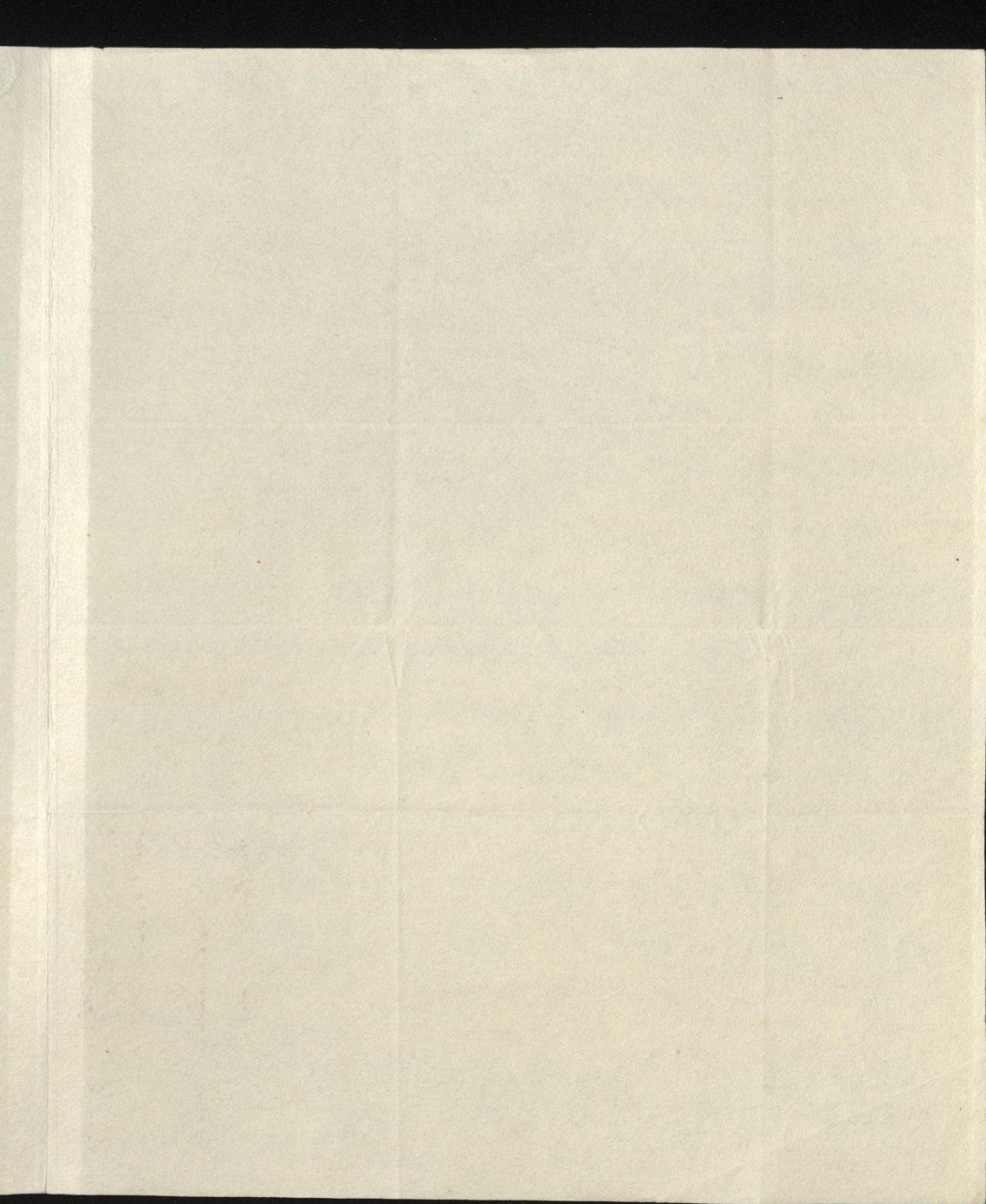

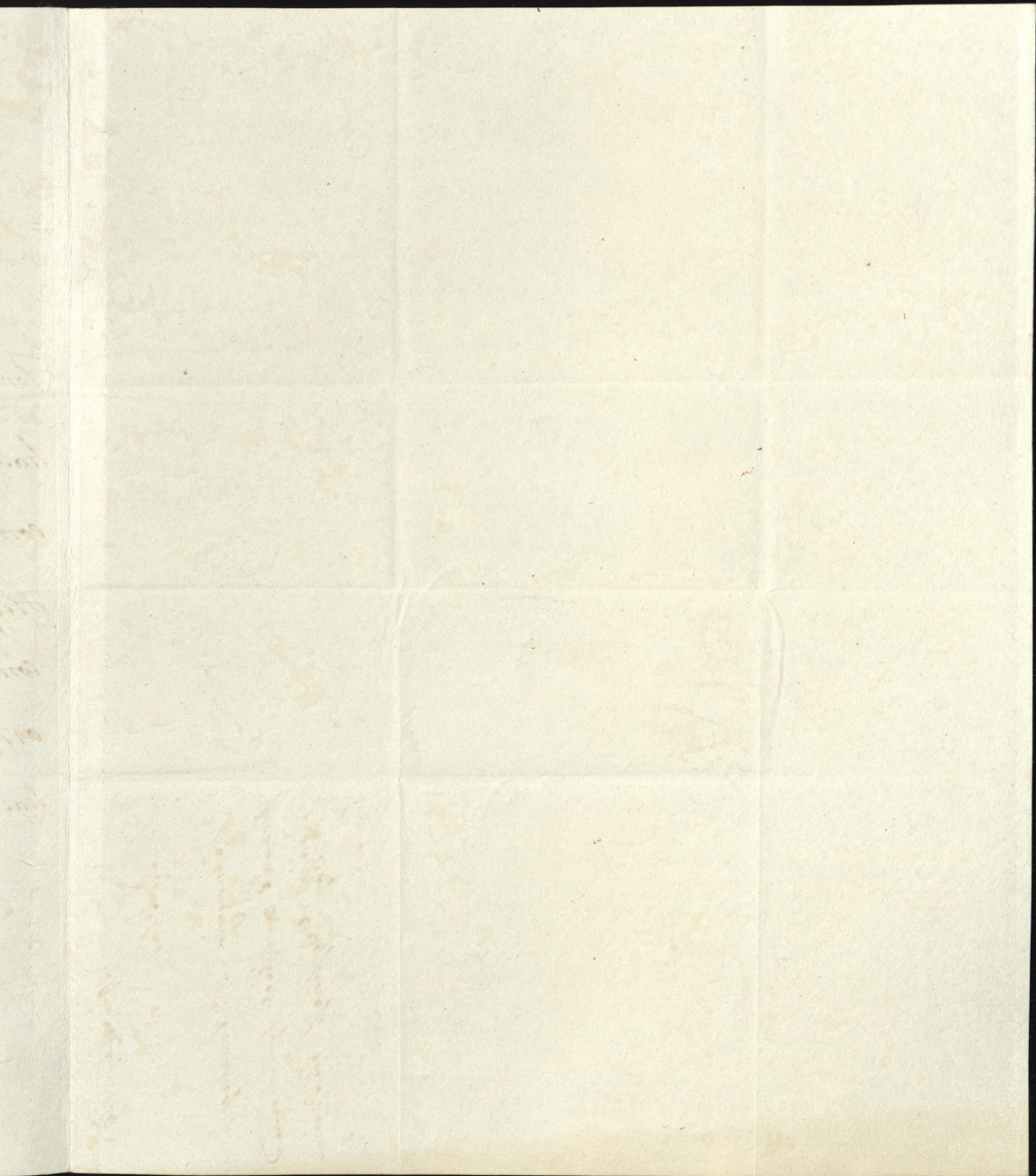
