



On the removal of His Majesty's valuable Collection
of Prints & Drawings from Buckingham House to Carlton
Palace in June 1825, it was necessary for me to pay the same
attention to them as I had done, therefore my whole time has
been devoted to Carlton Palace, and have not received any
Salary from His Majesty's Library since their removal.
I hope His Majesty will not think me extravagant, if
I say £50 for the year. And if it should be His Majesty's
pleasure for me to go on with the Theatricals, Charades,
and Granges, and pay attention to the Prints & Drawings,
I will attend to them all for the same salary as I had
when at Buckingham House £100 per annum, or leave
it to His Majesty's gracious pleasure.

Statement of Mr. Harding, Librarian
to Her late Majesty.

Upon the demise of Her Most Gracious
Majesty, Sir Herbert Taylor brought me
a Message from His Royal Highness The
Prince Regent, expressive of His Royal
Highness's approbation of my attention
to Her late Majesty, and "that I should
be made comfortable"

Sir Herbert afterwards finding, that
he had not sufficient funds to carry the
gracious intention (expressed by His Royal
Highness towards me,) into effect, placed
me in the situation formerly held by Mr.
Chamberlain in the Library, to take care
of the Prints and Drawings, with a Salary

of One Hundred a Year, in aid of my
Pension, which was to the same amount.

Upon the removal of the Prints and
Drawings from Buckingham House to
Carlton House, and of the Library to
Kensington, it was not possible for me
to be of service to Mr. Barnard in the
Library, because the Prints and Drawings
required my whole attention: I therefore
wrote to Mr. Barnard to that effect,
since which my Salary has been stopped,
tho' originally given in aid of my pension;
but the Duties of my Situation, vizt. the
care of the Prints and Drawings, have
nevertheless been duly performed, until
D^r. Summer took the Collection out of
my care.

In February 1820. I received His Majesty's most gracious Commands, through Sir Gilgrave Turner, to arrange His Majesty's Collection of Theatrical Portraits, and to furnish Biographical Sketches of the Actors: To accomplish this, I was obliged to employ a Writing Master, and to incur expences, which His Majesty, appearing to be aware of, upon one occasion, spontaneously ordered a sum of £ 50. to be paid to me on account thereof; since which a Bill of expences, signed, as being approved by Sir Gilgrave Turner, amounting to £ 149. has also been paid; and expences have subsequently been incurred in the further progress of this work, amounting to about £ 220.

By the additional Purchase of £5.
worth of Prints, the Eighth Volume may
be completed: And the whole, if
continued down to the present day, would
be comprised in Ten Volumes.*

His Majesty's gracious sanction of
my labours, has been frequently, and
condescendingly expressed; but the case
of His Majesty's Prints and Drawings being
now taken from me, I humbly trust that
the grounds upon which the Salary of
£100. a year was originally granted, as an
aid to my Pension, will be thought deserving
the benevolent consideration of His
Majesty.
