I venture to request your acceptance of it, because (however defective) it still contains the real sentiments of the Author, whose true opinions on this last you ought to know, and because it attempts to pay due respect to his Predecessors in that Chair, which the bounteous situation of His Majesty enables him to fill.

Should you on perusing it, (as the delivery of some address was an official duty in the President of His Majesty's Academy,) deem it not unworthy, at some fit moment, of the Royal Eye, endeavors that parts only, may not be seen or read, as I am aware that in the extent of my impressions on some points, I may possibly have the misfortune of not being justified by His Majesty's acquiescence. You privately know my sentiments of the knowledge and Utility

might think it quite unworthy, or

 penitence, and apprehension, and how
