sight of the Portrait, it is now perhaps
impossible to ascertain what Sir Thomas
Lawrence's motives or intentions were, at the
time he sent this Picture, to Carlton House,

whether as a gift, and token of gratitude for
favours received from Sir John Moore Mahon,
perhaps now cannot be ascertained, in consequence
of the unskillful transition which has taken
place from Life to Death, of that great and
