Sir,

I have seen Mr. Bacon since I was honored with your letter, and beg leave to assure you that I am entirely mistaken in naming the amount of Thirty Five Guineas for a marble bust ~~of~~ Inchoed. I must acknowledge that it was done without having previously consulted Mr. Bacon on the subject. I was led into the error by not reflecting on the difference between a bust of Marble and my own. I find the usual Price of a highly finished Marble Bust is one hundred Guineas both with Mr. Bacon, and every other Artist of equal Eminence.

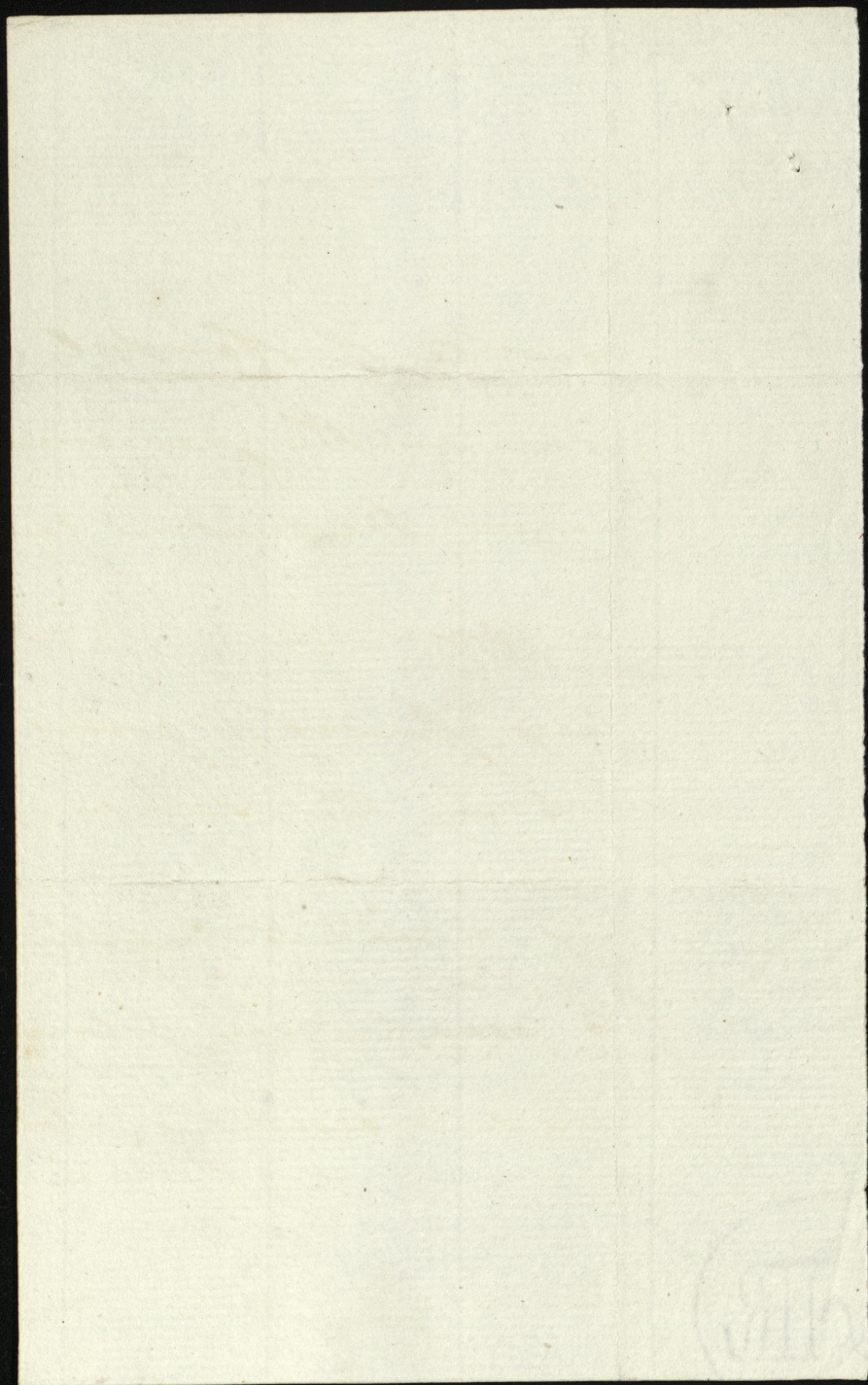

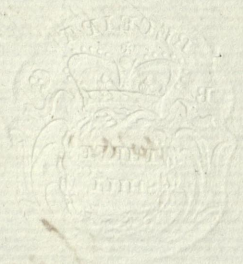

Sir,

I did myself the Honour of writing you two Letters; but by some accident I suppose, they did not reach you; as I have not been favoured with an answer to either of them.

In those Letters I requested, that you would have the Goodness to present my humble Duty to his Royal Highness, the Prince of Wales - to deliver in my Account of Marble Busts done by his Command; and to express my Hope, that His Royal Highness would take my Case into his Consideration.

The amount of my Account, (inclosed in those Letters,) was five hundred & four Pounds; which would be of great use to me at present; as I am at considerable Expence, for Marble, & workmen's wages: And as you mention'd, when you order'd the Bust, that it wou'd be argent comptant, I certainly did hope to have been paid long ago.

Three of the Busts were sent by order to Carlton House - and the fourth to Holland-House, as her Ladyship requested.

If it should not be convenient to you to present the inclosed account; I beg you will have the Goodness to inform me, to whom I am to make application for that purpose; and you will much oblige

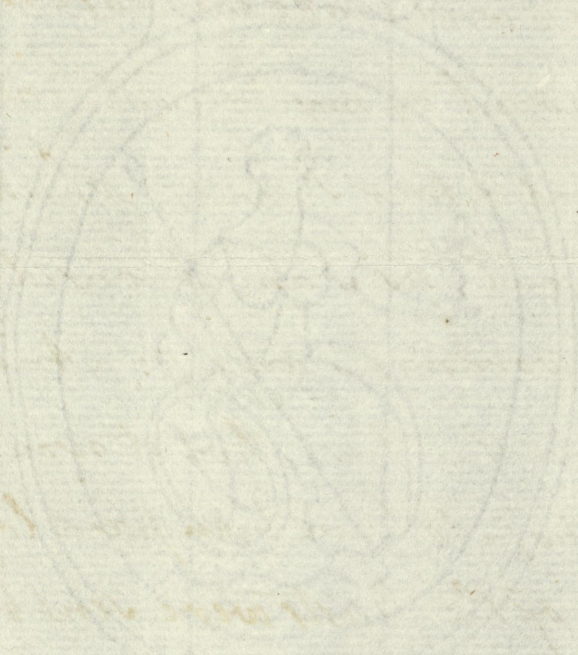
