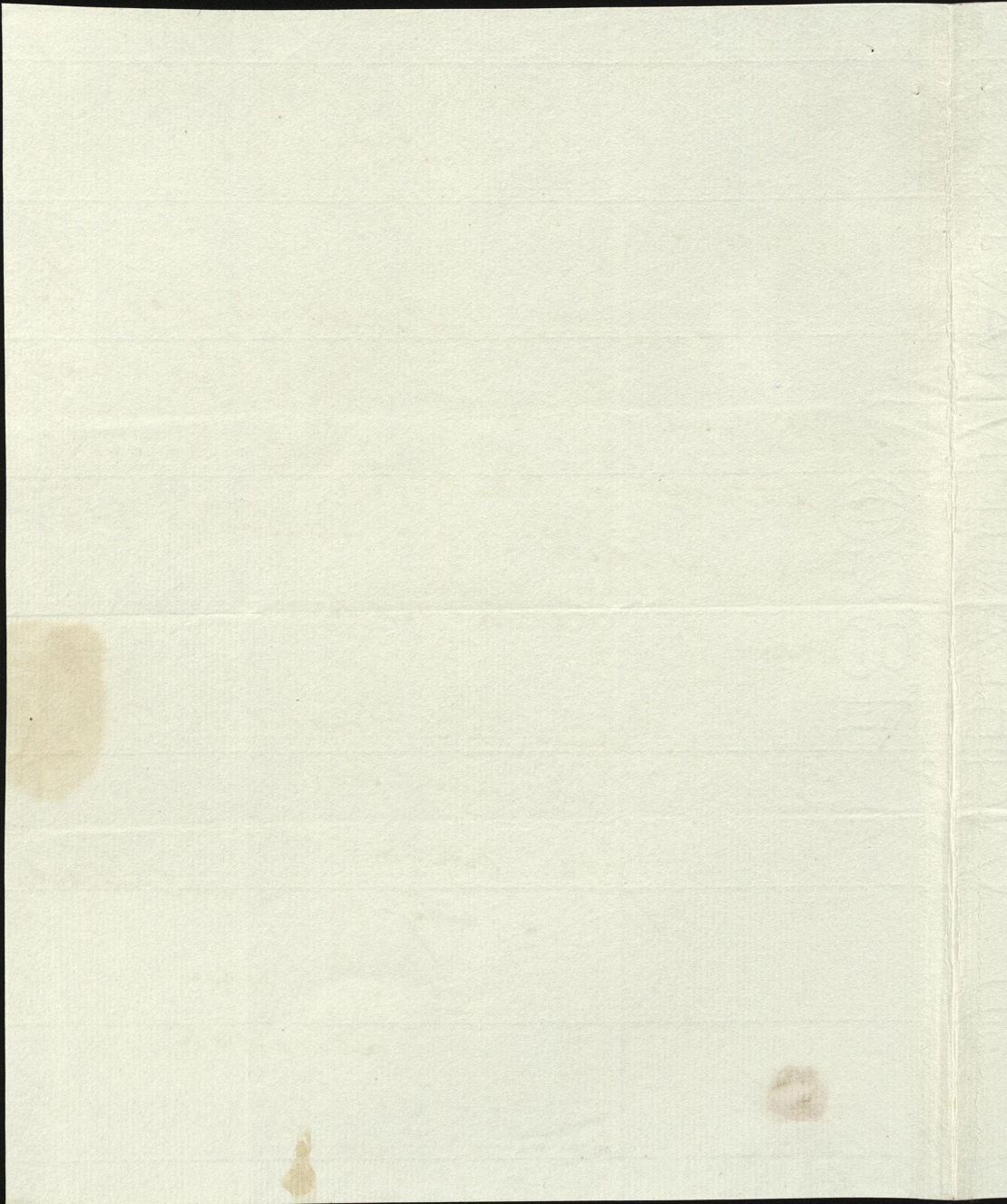

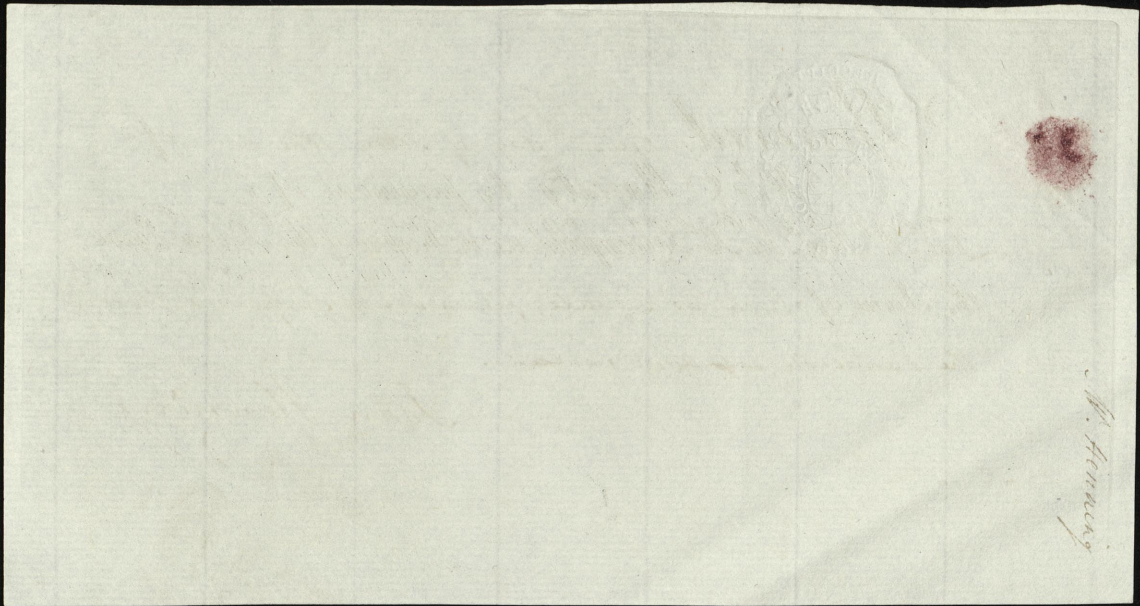

ELGIN MARBLES.

Mr. HENNING begs to inform his Friends and Subscribers, that he has changed his Residence to

No. 35, LOWER THORNHAUGH STREET, BEDFORD SQUARE.

HE has the satisfaction to inform the admirers of Grecian Art, that he has completed his Miniature Bas Reliefs from the Frieze of the Cella of the Parthenon—that most magnificent monument of ancient Athenian grandeur, built by Phidias, in the age of Pericles, many fragments of which are deposited in the British Museum. This Work contains the entire series of that frieze, which has been so much celebrated, for the beauty of the workmanship, as well as for the number and variety of the objects which are sculptured upon it—nearly five hundred human figures, horses, bulls, &c. being a representation of the great religious Festival of the Tribes of Athens. In the Work it is endeavoured to give a faithful transcript of the remains of the Originals, and to give the restorations the same character; the reception which this effort has experienced from good Judges, gives reason to hope that it may be found interesting to Men of Taste, as illustrative of the art, manners, and mythology of the ancient Greeks. It has been done to a scale of a twentieth of the originals; being two inches high, and twenty-four feet four inches long; published in six parts, from forty-six to fifty-four inches long, each part framed at length separately; they form elegant ornaments for a chimney-piece; or, fitted up in imitation of volumes, are adapted to the library. Any part, or portion of a part, can be had separately.

ENCOURAGED by his Subscribers, he is proceeding with a similar series, from the Phygalian Marbles, also in the British Museum, to such a scale as to answer as a companion to those of the Parthenon, thus making a desirable selection of Greek Iconology; these marbles are understood to represent the Battle of the Amazons and Centaurs against the Lapithae. He has lately finished three Bas Reliefs from Raphael's Cartoons; The Charge to Peter, The Draught of Fishes, and Paul with Barnabas at Lystra. They are done six inches high; the reception of these has emboldened him to proceed with the series, which will be published with as little delay as possible; he begs to say that there is not any advance of money on Subscribing.

Mr. H. continues to model Likenesses, Medallions, Busts, &c. from the size of a SEAL or RING to any magnitude; also designs and models Compositions for Monuments, &c.

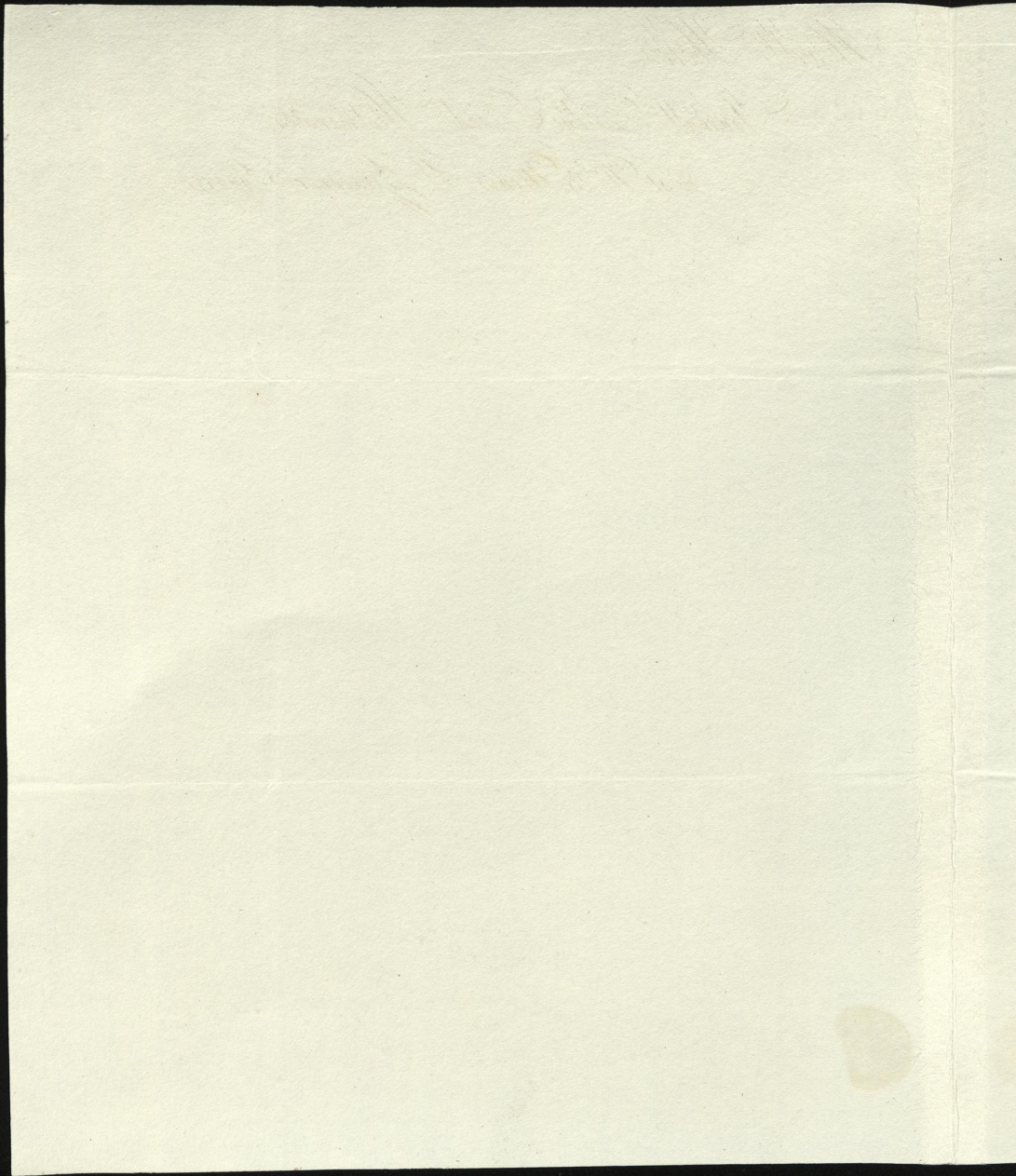

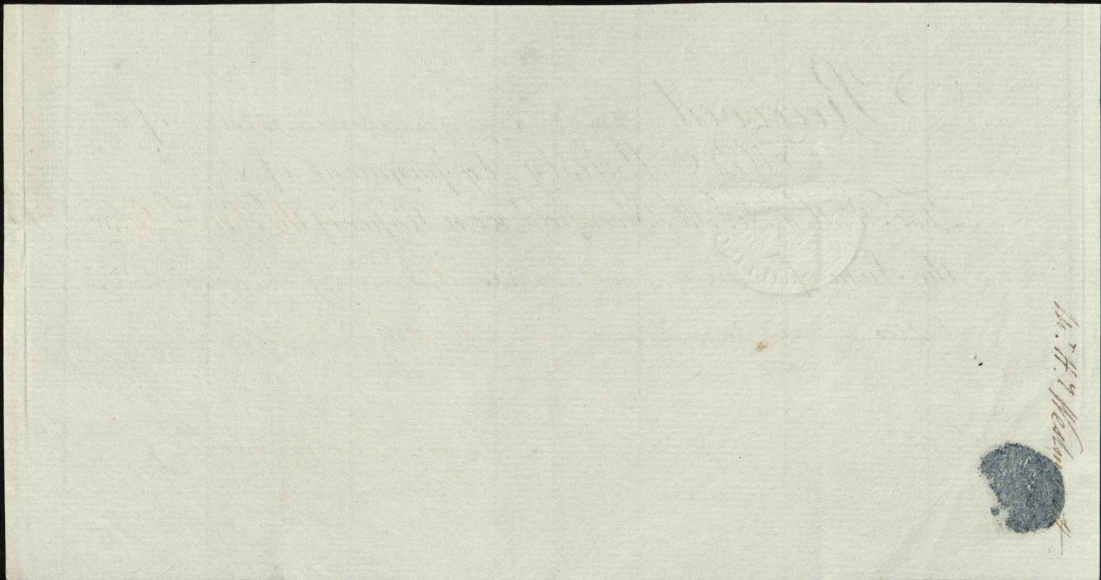

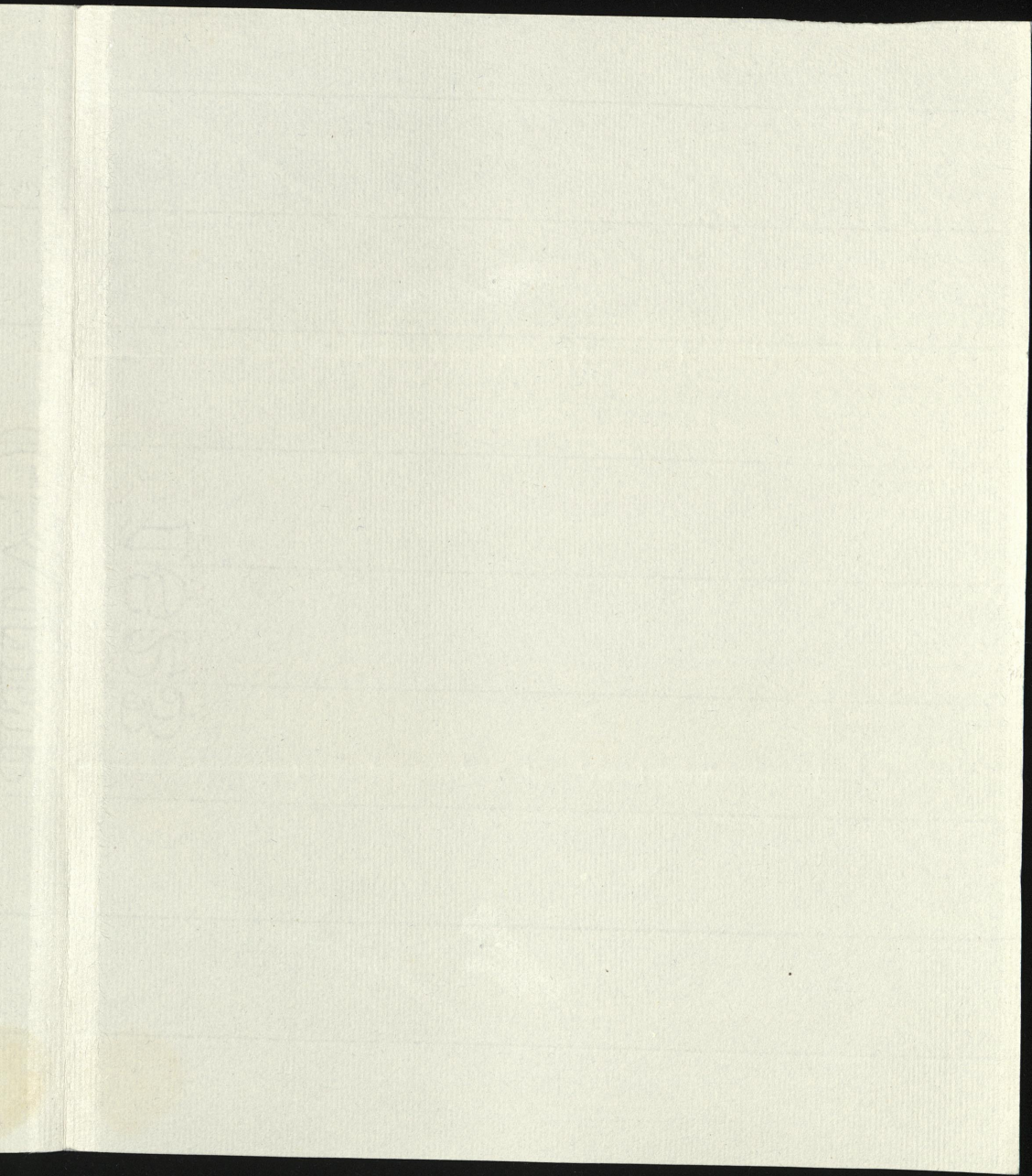
