Sir

As Solicitor to the Executors of the late Mr. Hamilton of the Royal Academy, I take the liberty of addressing you on a subject, in which I shall feel particularly obliged by your friendly interference.

Mr. Hamilton died in December Twelvemonth, and not being in very affluent circumstances, the whole of his effects, his collection of Books Pictures Drawings and Works of Art, including all his own works in the Possession of his Family were sold by Auction in May last by Mr. Harry Phillips for the benefit of his Widow and Three Children. — His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales happened to see this Collection while it was on view previous to the sale,

And expressed a desire of purchasing two of the Drawings, The subjects of which were The Nymph Irigone visited by Bacchus, - And Aylas surprized by the nymphs, while Bathing. - They were large, very highly finished, in colours, & elegantly framed, and evidently two of the finest drawings in the Collection, and in Mr. Hamilton's best style. - His Royal Highness did not however attend the Sale but being informed by Mr. Phillips of the state of the Family's affairs, with his wonted liberality desired Mr. Phillips to make an offer to The Family of an hundred Guineas for the Pair which he said he would immediately give, if they would accept it. - The offer was graciously received, and the drawings withdrawn from the sale, and delivered at Carlton House as directed immediately

afterwards. — From that time to the present, nothing has been heard of them, and altho' many applications have been made to Mr. Phillips, no satisfactory answer has ever been obtained. —

We have therefore taken the Liberty of soliciting in the favor of you to lay this matter before his Royal Highness, being fully persuaded it must have escaped his memory, and that when he is reminded of it, he will direct this sum to be paid, which I assure you, trifling as it may appear to you, is an object of the greatest importance to the Family.
