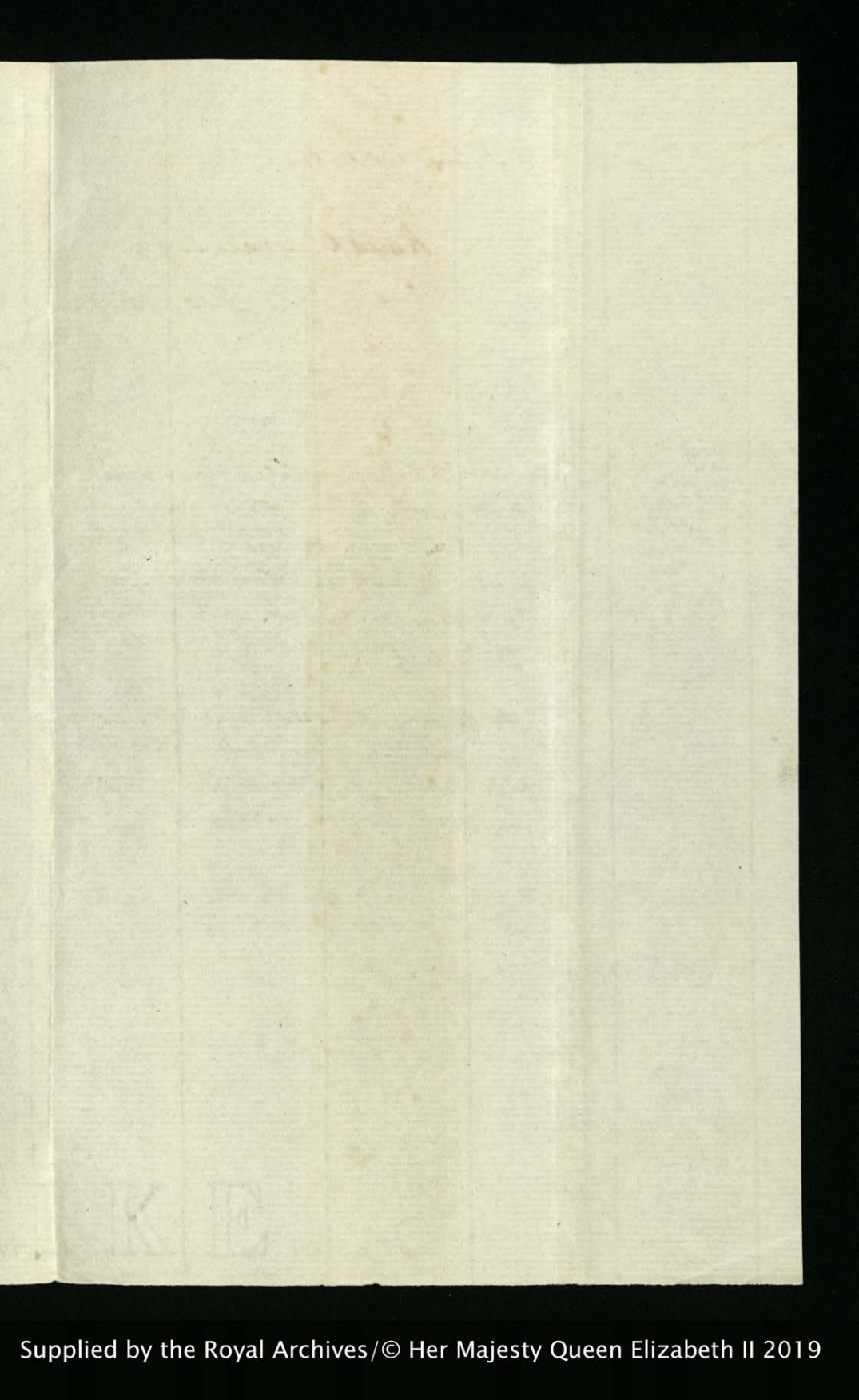
Then delivered to the late Admiral Payne

 December 1st delivered by the Admiral to
 His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales

N.B. Having some time there after found it
 necessary to make improvements and additions
 the Barr of Legitimacy &c. another Copy thus
 improved was also delivered to His Royal
 Highness, by General Hulse along with the Dates
 or my Commission from Lord Keith as acknowledged
 by General Hulse who on the day that the Persian
 Ambassador dined with the Prince delivered this
 last Copy to His Highness, and rather of which
 has ever been paid for, as the Compiler is ready
 to depend upon Oath if required, and being
 in Great distress for want of money to Enable him to
 return to Scotland begs leave as advised at
 Carlton House to state his Case and Pleam with all
 Humble Submission for the Consideration of
 Robert Gray Esq^r at Somerset House
