

one copy of the Royal Genealogy of the King
of Scotland, and of Great ^{Br. Itæn} since the reunion
of the Crowns in the Person of King James VI
first Monarch of Great Britain, the which
copy highly finished was on the following day
December 1st delivered by the Admiral to
His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales

N.B. Having some time there after found it
necessary to make improvements and addition
the Barr of Legitimacy &c another copy thus
improved was also delivered to His Royal
Highness, By General Hulse along with the Date
or my Commission from Lord Keith as acknowledged
by General Hulse who on the day that the Russian
Ambassador dined with the Prince delivered this
last copy to His Highness, and neither of which
has ever been paid for, as the Compiler is ready
to depound upon Oath if required, and being
in great distress for want of Money to enable him to
return to Scotland begs leave as advised at
Carlton House to Steat his Ease and Gleam with all
Humble Submission for the consideration of
Robert Gray Esqur at Somerset House
