Lord North has the honour of sending

The first is a note from the Chancellor,  
requesting that his Majesty would send  
to the House of Lords a Commission  
on Thursday to pass a number of private  
Bills, & give his Royal speech on  
Friday to the Great Bells.

The second is a letter from Mr  
Burdwyn at Cairo containing a  
very bad piece of news, viz: the

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death of <sup>Mr</sup> John Cuning. Ld North would fain believe that it is not true, but it comes from too good authority, & is too ~~con-~~ = want to the account formerly received of <sup>Mr</sup> Robin's bad state of health, not to cause much uneasiness in those who know how valuable his life was to his family & the Public.

The letter from the Solicitors & Mr Eden, with the instance from Mr Pittney shew'd to be sent to his

Majesty; His Majesty will see the state of the Paris negotiation; & if it is agreeable to his Majesty to return any answer to Mr Davis's question, Ld North will not fail to inform Mr Eden of it, ~~before~~ tomorrow morning, before he goes to court.
