To Lord North, his last letter I have received from you  
plainly shows that at all events you expect to be  
released from your situation at the close of this  
Session, and that you cannot extricate yourself  
that small period if the law arrangements you  
yourself had proposed to me take effect; I think  
it upon the whole best to make no arrangement  
during this session, and therefore you are dispensed  
from taking any steps concerning the present  
Attorney and Solicitor Generals or any successors  
to them; which those will enable you to pass  
the next week quickly at Bushy, that you may  
recruit your mind to carry on the business in  
the House of Commons for the remains of this  
Session.
