CAPTAIN G. N. HARDINGE. (1781-1808)

THE Admirers of the late *Captain George Nicholas Hardinge*, are desirous to possess an engraved Representation of Mr. CHARLES MANNING's Design for the National Monument of that gallant Officer, in St. Paul's Cathedral, voted by the House of Commons without a dissenting Voice, and which Monument he is executing. They have taken the liberty, therefore, of apprizing those who love and revere British Heroism, that such a Representation will be published with all practicable speed upon the following

CONDITIONS:

- I.—This Print is to be engraved in the *Line Manner* by Mr. WILLIAM SHARP, and the size of it is to be Eighteen Inches in width, by Fourteen in height.
- II.—Price to be One Guinea, which is to be paid at the time of subscribing, and for which a Receipt will be given.
- III.—The Engraving is to commence when a sum equal to the Cost of the Work has been actually paid.

N.B. The *Line Manner* has been substituted in place of the *Mezzotinto*, without any change of the Subscription Sum, at the earnest request of those who are zealous promoters of the Object.

Summary Description of the Design.

IN the Centre of the Composition is a *Cenotaph* having on its front a *Lion's Head*, the Emblem of British Valour; on the right of it, is a *Native Indian* bearing the *Naval Flag*, whose Countenance and pensive Attitude point at the deep regret felt and expressed by the Communities of India, upon the fall of their zealous Defender; on the left, at the foot of the *Cenotaph*, is *Fame*, prostrate, with a *Laurel Wreath* in her Hand, which falls over the youthful Hero's *Name*, on the Pedestal, indicating the disappointment of her sanguine hopes, at his *early Fate*.
