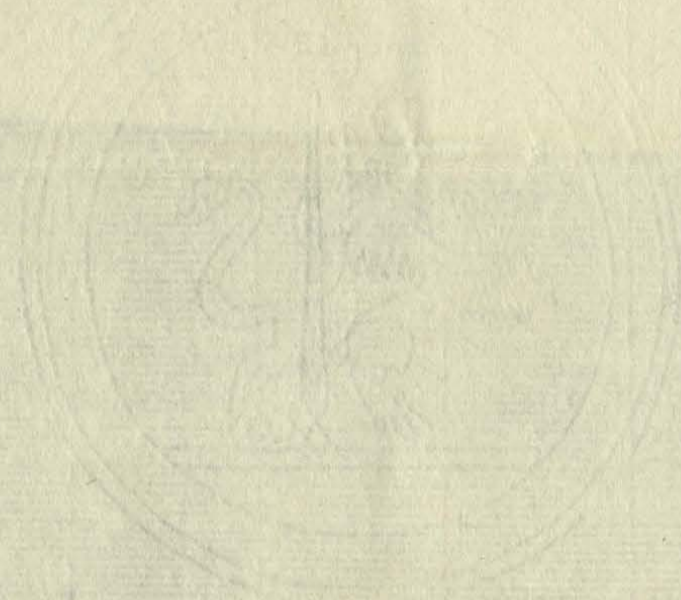

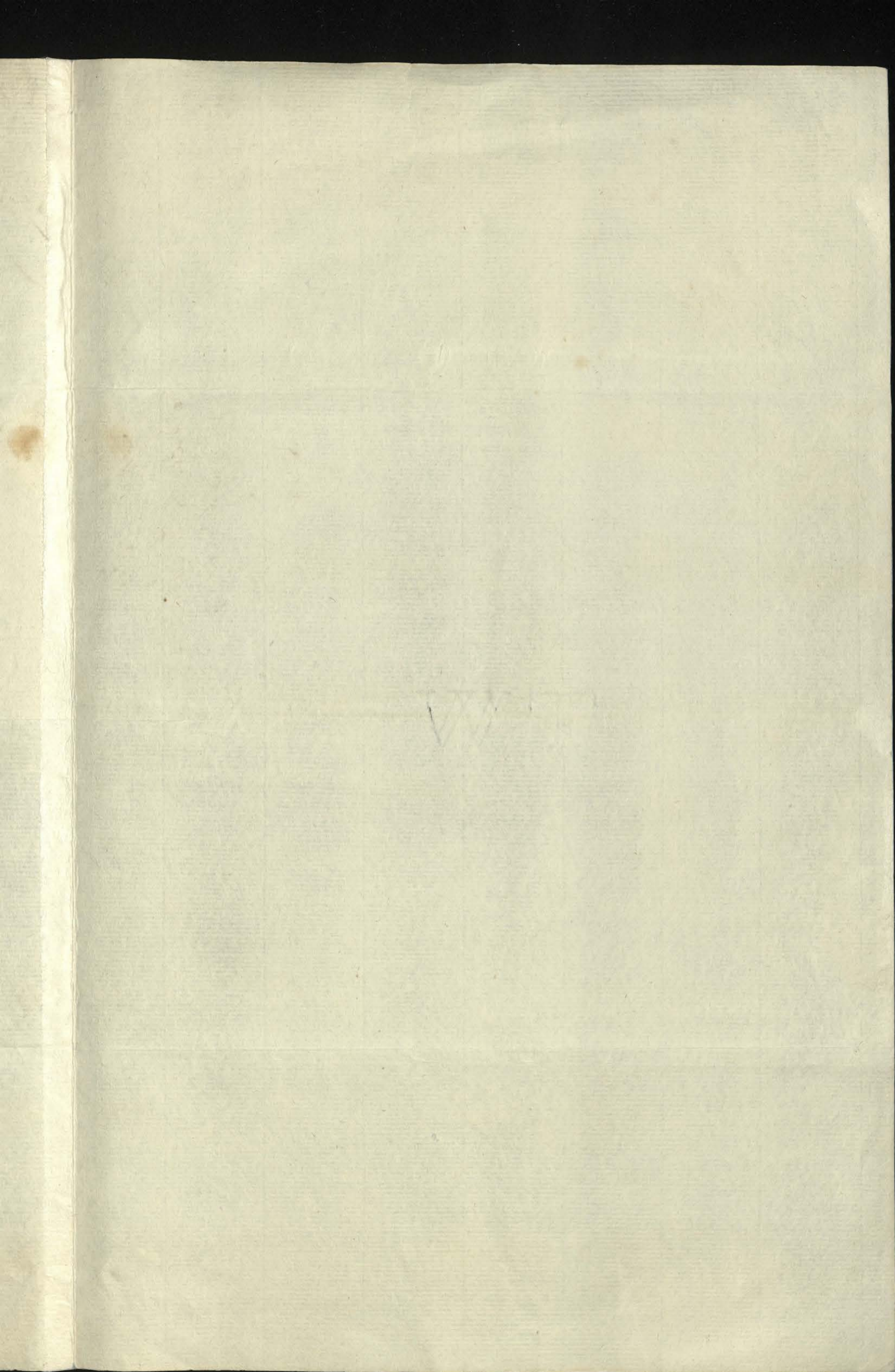

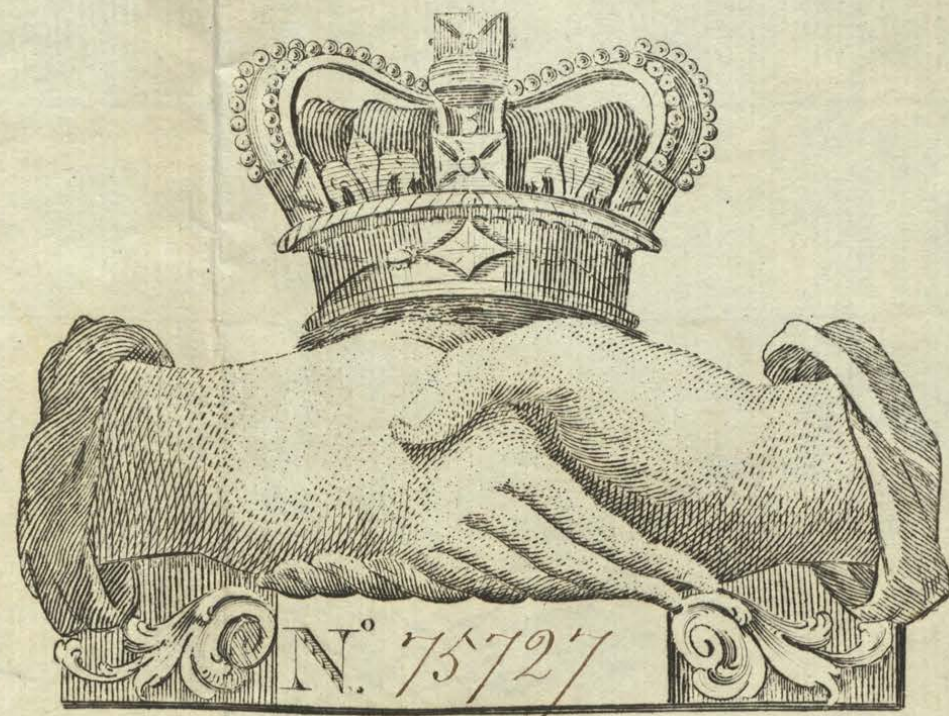

for the term of seven Years from the date hereof & so on for the further term or terms of seven years so long as the said Henry Dyle his Executors, Administrators or Assigns shall continue to pay the premium & Deposit for insuring the said Building & so long as the said amicable Contributionship or Society shall agree to accept the same, the particular admeasurements & valuation of which premises are farther set forth in the Margin hereof.
