Sir

I enclose per favour of Mr Bott Ind^d the acc^{ts} of Taxes & to Michelsons last for your perusal rather than putting them in the hands of Mr Suckor, as I wish to make some observations upon them the which he could not so readily do, nor would it be a subject for a publick office I mean as to the situation I am in and the cause of my addressing you on the Subject. My being on the Royal Establishment as Deliverer of Coal-wood Charcoal &c and residing in Augusta Lodge I was requested by Mr Brown to take the payment of the taxes &c in hand which I have done for eight years past and was desired particularly to attend to those Thurston who form part of the poor's rates and who occupy houses & land &c the private property of his Majesty and pay y^e poor's rates for such to entitle them to Vote at Elections. But who were by me to be repaid in the $\frac{1}{2}$ yearly accounts. This I need not inform you was kept as much as possible from the opposite party. And should His present Majesty or his confidential servants think this now unnecessary they ought to be thrown all into the article £18.3.0 which is paid to the Collector. The last acc^t I have left open not charging my usual $\frac{1}{2}$ yearly Salary of
