Sir

I am favoured with your letter of the 23th instant and its inclosure - Mr Harrison has this morning had Mr Collett with him on the subject of the Rates & Taxes upon the late King's private property at Windsor - Mr Harrison I think satisfactorily explained to you that as this property is now held in right of the Crown, His present Majesty is not assessable; but where the Houses are occupied by parties, not actual Servants of the King, such parties are themselves liable to the payment of the parochial Rates - This applies to the house late Brawn's, the house late Mr Moore's and the Lower Lodge - and it will be necessary that these premises be assessed in the names of the persons having the beneficial occupation.

Mr Collett, has been instructed to see the Assessors on this subject, and when the assessment is properly made, and the Receipts are made out in the names of the respective parties, it is His Majesty's gracious pleasure as an Act of Bounty to defray the Rates on the above premises out of His Privy Purse, - but it is the anxious desire of those who have the honor to act for His Majesty to have it thoroughly understood that no claim of right can be made upon His Majesty in this respect, and that consequently no assessment must stand in His Name.

Mr Collett will probably be enabled in the course of
next week to make up an Account which will include the several
Amounts due for the Poor's Rates of the Lower Lodge, the House
late Brown's & the House late Morris's, when he will be supplied
with the means of paying them.

With regard ^{to} the Lower News & the Tailor's Shop
I am directed to state that, being in His Majesty's own occupation, and
used for purposes relating to the Royal Establishment, they are not
assessable. —

As no reason is alleged for the discontinuance by
the Office of Woods of the payment of the Rates upon the House
in Datchett Lane, it is considered that Application should
be made to that Office on this head. —

I have only further to add that Mr Collett has
been desired to wait upon you, and it is hoped you will
be spared all unnecessary trouble.

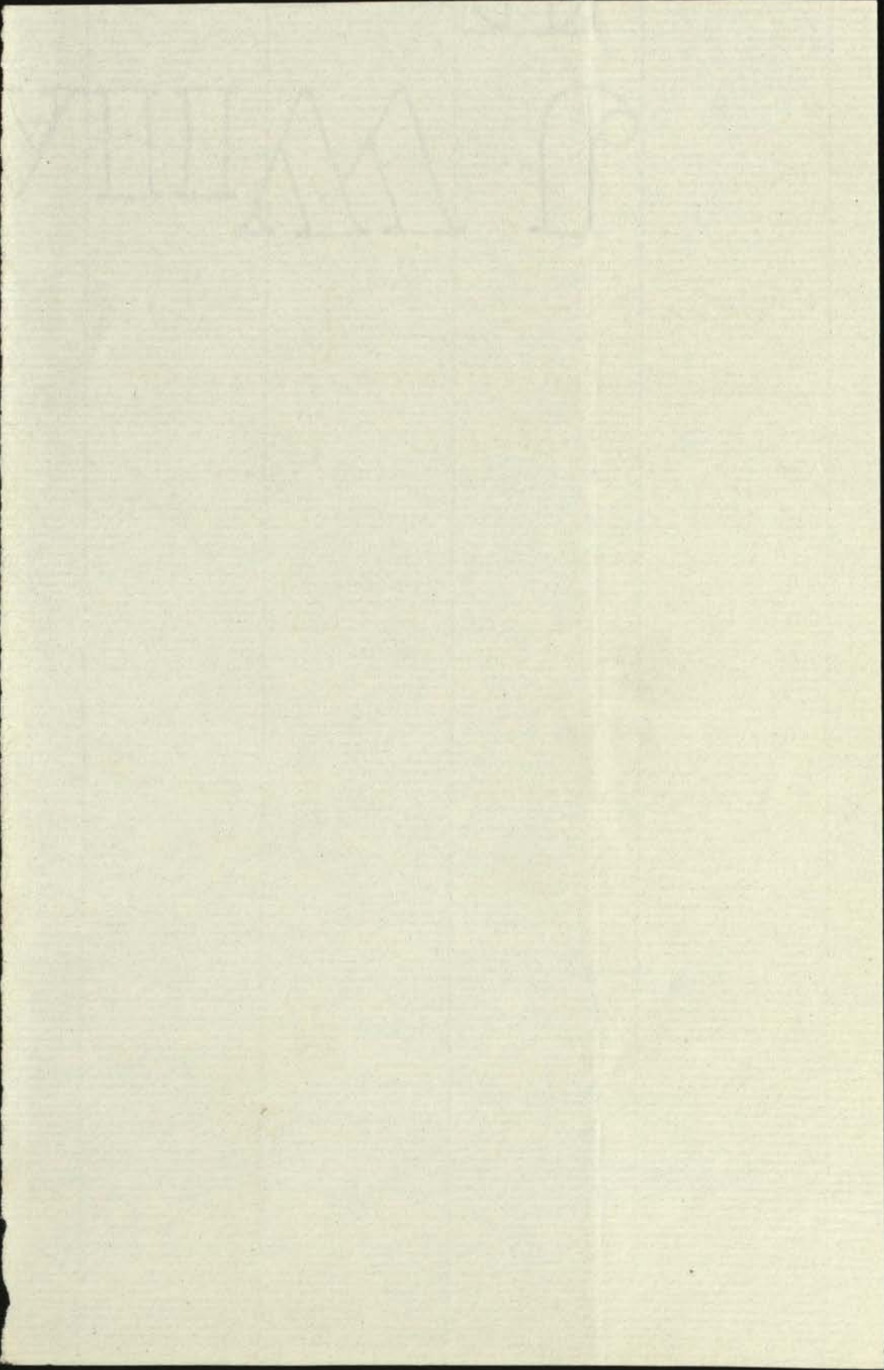

Your Account of the Rates & Taxes to Lady day last, on the Lower Lodge, the House in St Albans Street occupied by Mr Moore, - and that late Mr Brawn's, is received, and a draft is in readiness to discharge the same whenever you can come to Town to receive it. - In your communications with the parties occupying the above premises it is desired that you will intimate to them that tho' the Arrears to the present period are thus allowed to them as an Act of Bounty, their future payment by His Majesty must still remain open for consideration, and whichever way it may be determined, it will behove you to persevere in seeing that no Assessment stands in the King's Name. -

I shall trouble you to draw out a fresh Schedule of all these Rates and Taxes as they now stand; that furnished by the late Mr Agnew does not at this day give a correct view of them - You need not however, set about it till you have seen me.
