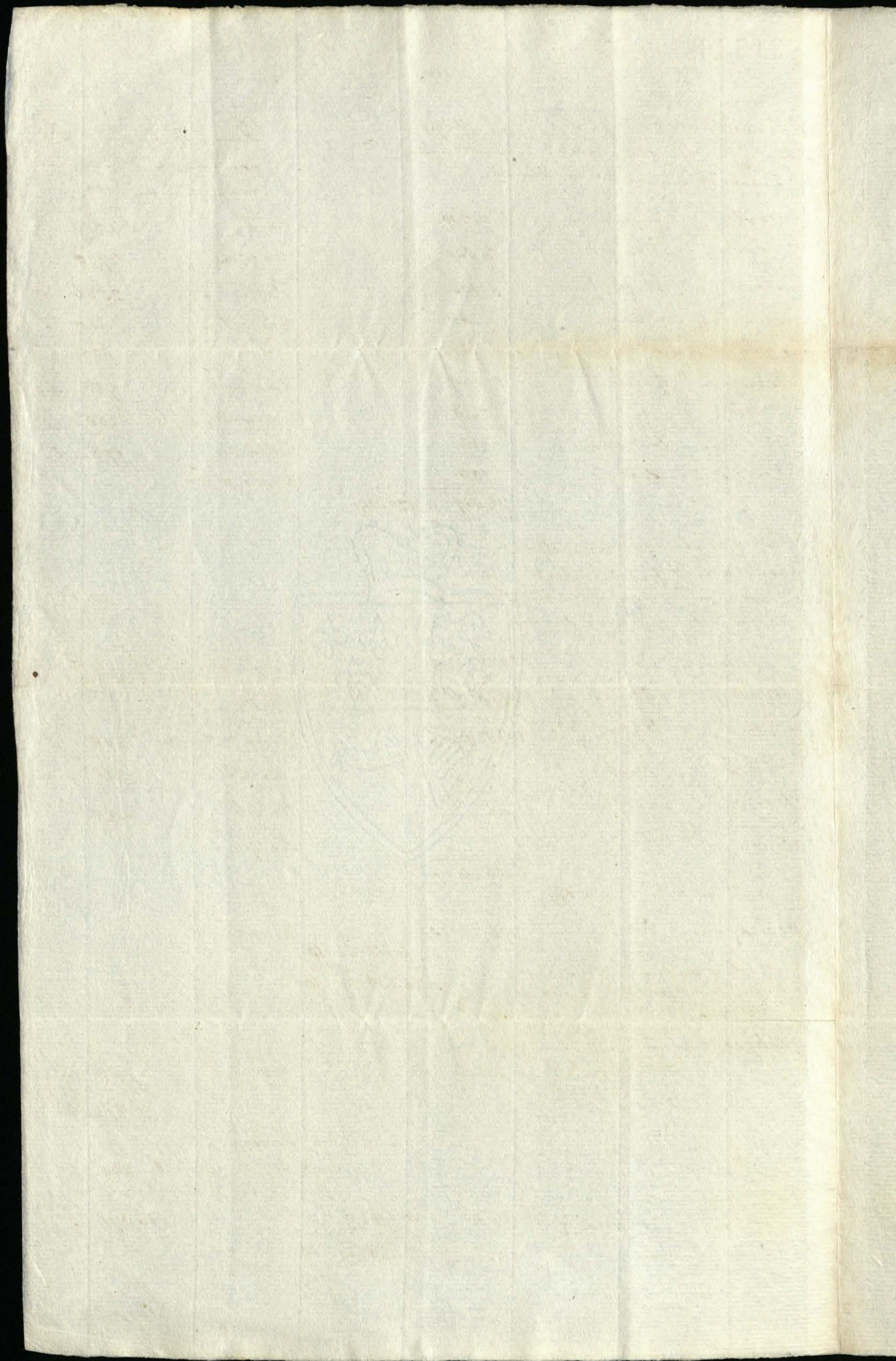

Sir

I hope your Royal Highness will be pleased to excuse me for thus intruding upon your attention, which no other Consideration could impel me to do than Respect for the Memory of a most deservedly beloved Parent. As your Royal Highness condescend'd to shew great Kindness to him I have an humble hope that you will look with indulgence on my present Solitude.

I have been much distressed to find that a Picture of King Charles the 1st by Vandyke lately in his Collection intended for your Royal Highness, has been sold, & I cannot sufficiently deplore the precipitancy with which it was disposed of, before the Circumstances connected with it were known. I have since found a Catalogue wherein that picture is expressly designated as for your Royal Highness. I therefore considered it my Duty to state this Circumstance, lest the transaction going unexplained, might lead to a Thought, that in any one instance my Father could be capable on an omission inconsistent with the enthusiastic attachment he bore to your Royal Highness. There is another Circumstance which has occasioned me so much grief that I humbly beg to say a few words upon it. A report industriously Circulated, has reached me, that my dear Father had not applied to your Royal Highness's service all the Monies issued to him from the office of the Duchy of Cornwall. Ignorant as I am

of the real state of the accounts, I cannot but feel the most
anxiety to obviate my misconception of his intention. I entreat
your Royal Highness to pardon me for laying before you the
inclosed paper, which I would never have done but to shew
that on his mind the impression was very different. The paper
was written at the time his disorder was first announced
dangerous. His encreasing sufferings ever afterwards prevented
him from arranging his accounts. I beg your Royal Highness
will condescend to excuse this intrusion, & believe me
to be with great devotion.

On examining a Statement, of the payments made by the late Mr Walsh Porter to the Tradesmen employed at Carlton House, and comparing it with the account of the sums which have been advanced to him for that purpose by His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, the following appears to be the result.

- 1 - That on the day of the date of the memorandum, of which the above is a copy, Mr Porter had received from His Royal Highness

Highness the sum of £13,250, of which he had paid no more than £11,997.16.0 (abatment being made for £200 which have been charged twice in Drinker & Henderson's account, as will be shewn hereafter) and his outstanding acceptances amounted to £800 only - therefore, after having allowed for these acceptances, he appears to have been then indebted to His Royal Highness the sum of £452.6.0, instead of being ten thousand pounds in advance.

2. - That the only sum which Mr Porter ever did advance, on account of His Royal Highness, was that of £600, to Mr Taylor on the 14th September 1805, which was made good to him on the 31st of October following, by a payment of £2000 - leaving him with £1,600 in hand; and the only subsequent payments which Mr Porter made in cash, were £200 to Mr Poole on the 4th December 1805, and £60 to Mr Francis on the 30 January 1806, after which he remained with £2590 in hand, a payment of £1250 having been made to him on the 20th January 1806 - nevertheless, from that period to the day of his decease, it appears that all payments were made in Bills, at two, three, four, five, and even ^{at} six months date, ~~notwithstanding it also appears,~~ ^{although} by the statement of a general Interest account, shews that Mr Porter had, upon an average for the whole time, a running balance of at least

£2,000 in hand.

3. That at the time of Mr Porter's decease he had received, altogether, the sum of £10,250 of which he had paid £16,271.9.0, leaving a balance in favor of His Royal Highness of £1,970.11.0 - besides £200 which are charged against Tucker and Henderson, as having been paid by a Bill at two months date on the 10th November 1806, which Bill was, however, only the renewal of a Bill for that sum which had been given at two months date on the 16th September preceding, and was then charged against them - and independent of the amount of the produce of all the lace and bullion which had been taken off from the old furniture, and for which there does not, at present, appear to have been any credit given.

4. That subsequent to the date of the above Memorandum Mr Porter has been paid £5,000 - nevertheless, it appears that a further sum of £42,650 is requisite for paying off ~~the whole of the Tradesmen's Bills~~ which ~~has been already received besides~~ ~~accepting~~ those of Messrs. Markell, Bartoli, and Sealy, which have not yet been delivered.
