This is merely to remind Lord North that the Week is nearly at an end, consequently there is no time to lose in fixing with the Attorney General whether Lord Suffolk can be persuaded to remain in his present Employment, as also to weigh the inconveniences that may arise if there is no alteration made in the Head of the Admiralty Commission, and whether Lord Howe will not before the expiration of the Week by the foundation of much alteration for the rest of the Session of Parliament which a subsequent fulfilling of the promises made him by Lord North whilst he commanded the North America, and rewarded by the Messages through the Channel of Lord Clarendon; yet not even at this hour thought of, addit to a mind of his delicacy must naturally give lasting disgust.
