at an end, that consequently there is no time to lose in fixing
with the Attorney General whether Lord Suffolk can be

and whether Lord Howe will not before the expiration of
this Week lay the foundation of much alteration for
the rest of the Session of Parliament which a subsequent
fulfilling of the promise made him by Lord North
he commanded in North America, as renewed by
the passage through the Channel of Lord Howe's
