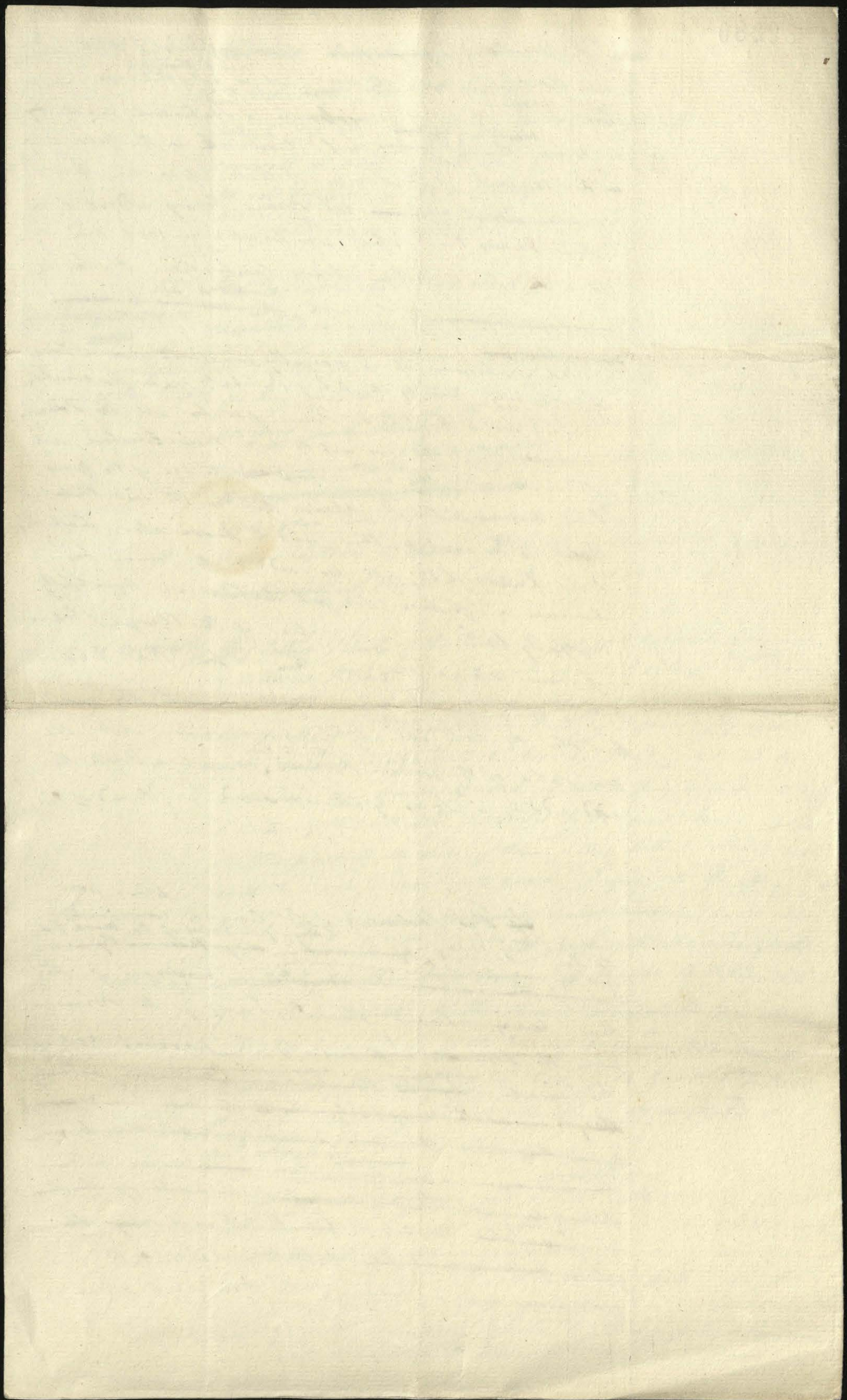

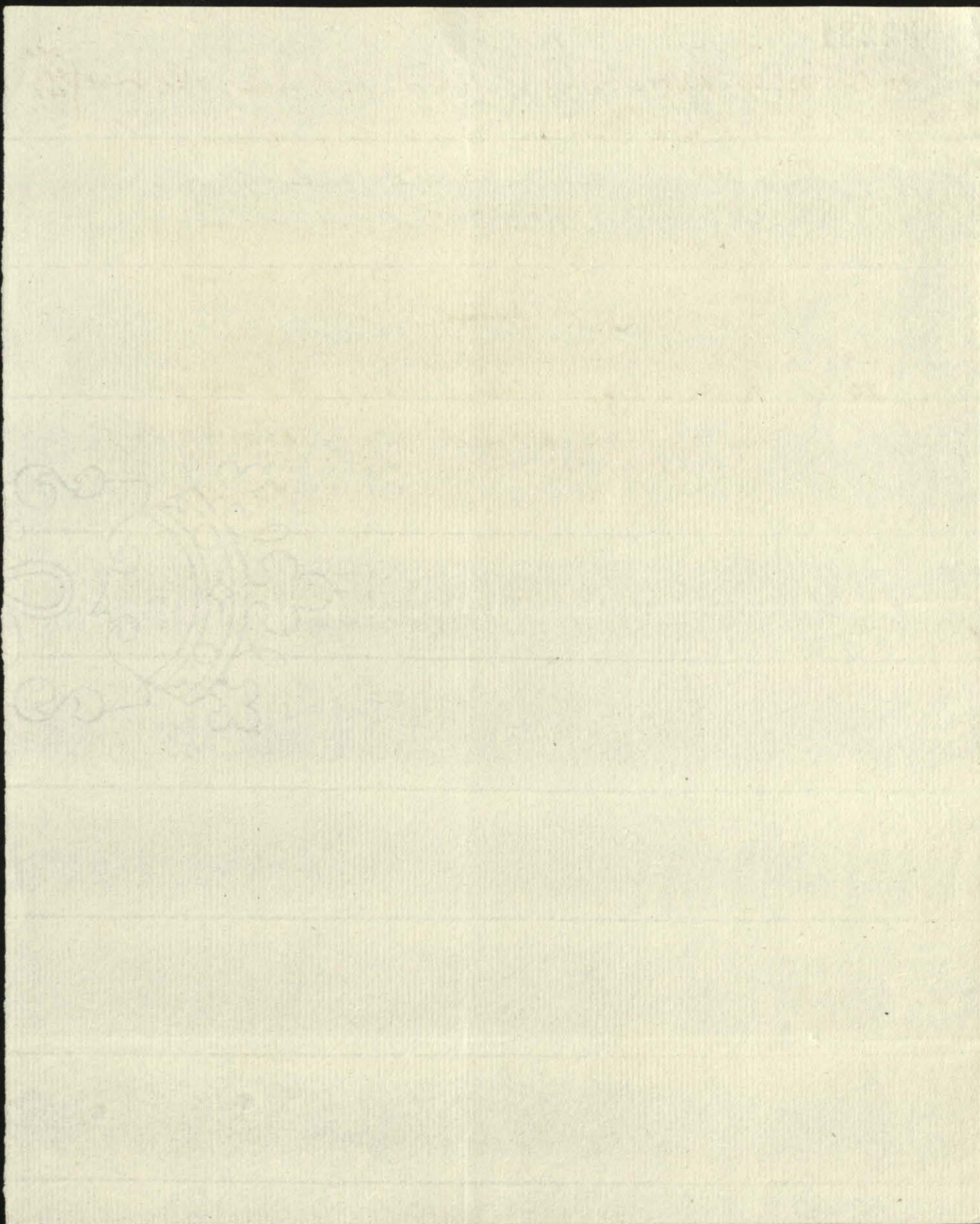

Present Statement compared with that of the Year 1803:

By a former State drawn out in the Year 1803, His Royal Highness's Annual Expenditure was ~~then~~ estimated at £80,000 ., which, deducted from the ^{then} Income of £133,000 ., left a Surplus of £45,000 ^{per Annum} applicable to the discharge of the Debt. This difference of £10,000 . arises from a diminution in the Income to the amount of £3000 . for the Property Tax, and an Increase in the Annual Expenditure to the amount of £7000 ., as shewn by the Accounts for the last Year, not including the extra charge of new Works at the Pavilion.

The Debt - may be estimated at £140,000 ., exclusive of what is due to the Landgrave, and on the Duch Loan: the precise amount cannot at present be ascertained, ^{any account of} ~~by reason~~ ^{being} that the Bills for the Midsummer Quarter are not all delivered; but from the actual State of Arrears to Lady Day last there is ^{no} reason to apprehend any material variation from the Estimate here given.

The liquidation of the Debt, by applying the Surplus of £35,000 ., would occupy four Years.
