

Under an Act of Parliament passed in the year 1795, (35. Geo. 3. cap. 129), an annuity of £60,000 - was granted to His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, commencing from 10.th October 1794; but the said annuity was made payable to Commissioners appointed for discharging certain debts then due from His Royal Highness, together with the yearly Sum of £13,000 - also made payable out of the Revenues of the Duchy of Cornwall, and commencing from 5.th July 1795.

This Appropriation of Income was intended to continue, as to the above yearly Sum of £13,000 - - until 5.th January 1805 inclusive; and as to the said annuity of £60,000 - until the 5.th July 1806 inclusive, when it was calculated that the whole of the Debts would be discharged; thus producing from the Duchy, in the course of $9\frac{1}{2}$ Years, £123,500 -, and from the annuity, in the course of $11\frac{1}{4}$ Years, £705,000 -, together making a total of £828,000 -.

But under a subsequent Act passed in the year 1803, (43. Geo. 3. Cap. 26), a further, tho' temporary, annuity of £60,000 - was settled upon His Royal Highness, to commence from and after the 5.th January 1803, and to continue until 5.th July 1806 inclusive, (when the first mentioned annuity was to become free), being a period of $3\frac{1}{2}$ Years, and making an additional Grant of £210,000 -, reduced, however, to £206,750, by the subsequent payment of £3250 - to the Commissioners

for

for one quarter to 5th April 1803 out of the Duchy
Revenues, under the first mentioned Act.

Besides the foregoing Sum of £206,750 -
His Royal Highness has received certain advances
made out of the 1½ p cent Duties, between April
1801 and December 1802, to the Amount of £18,000,
making altogether the Sum of £224,750 - received
from the Public since the period of fixing His
Royal Highness's Income in the Year 1795 at
£120,000 - p annum -

Previous Sums voted by Parliament.

On 4 May 1707, when £10,000 - p annum was added
to The Prince's Income by increasing the same from
£50,000 to £60,000 - yearly, - there was at the same
time a Vote for issuing £101,000 out of the Civil
List for His Royal Highness's service (viz.)

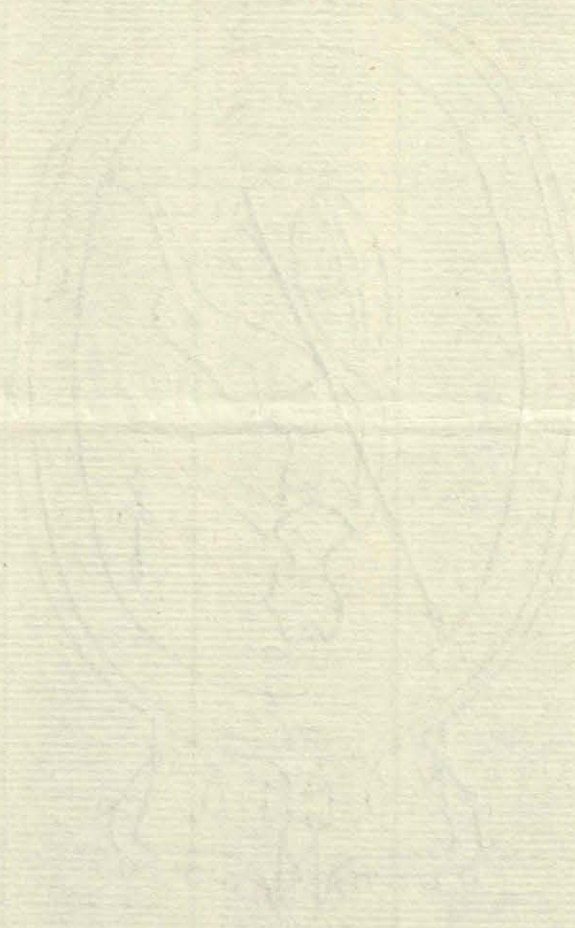

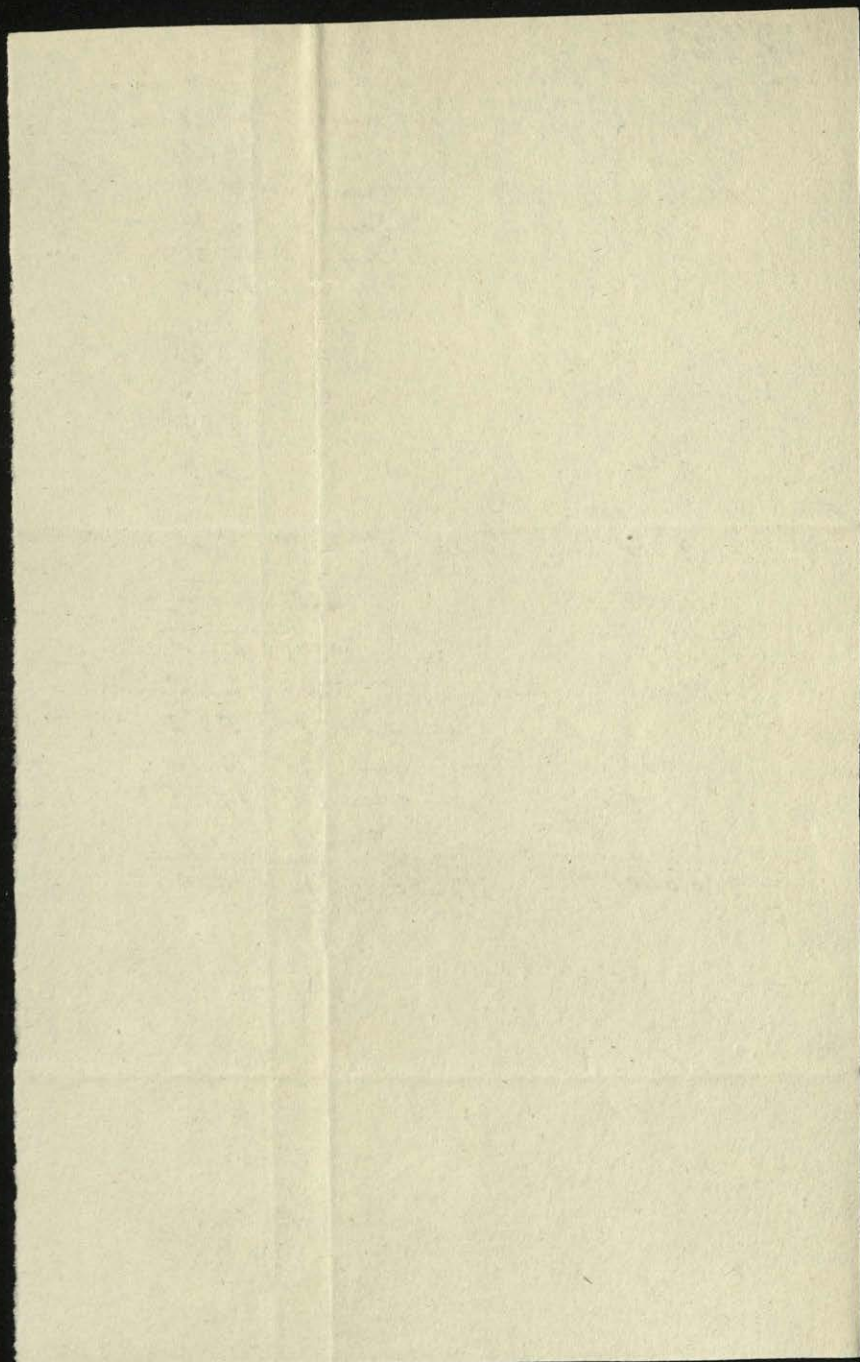

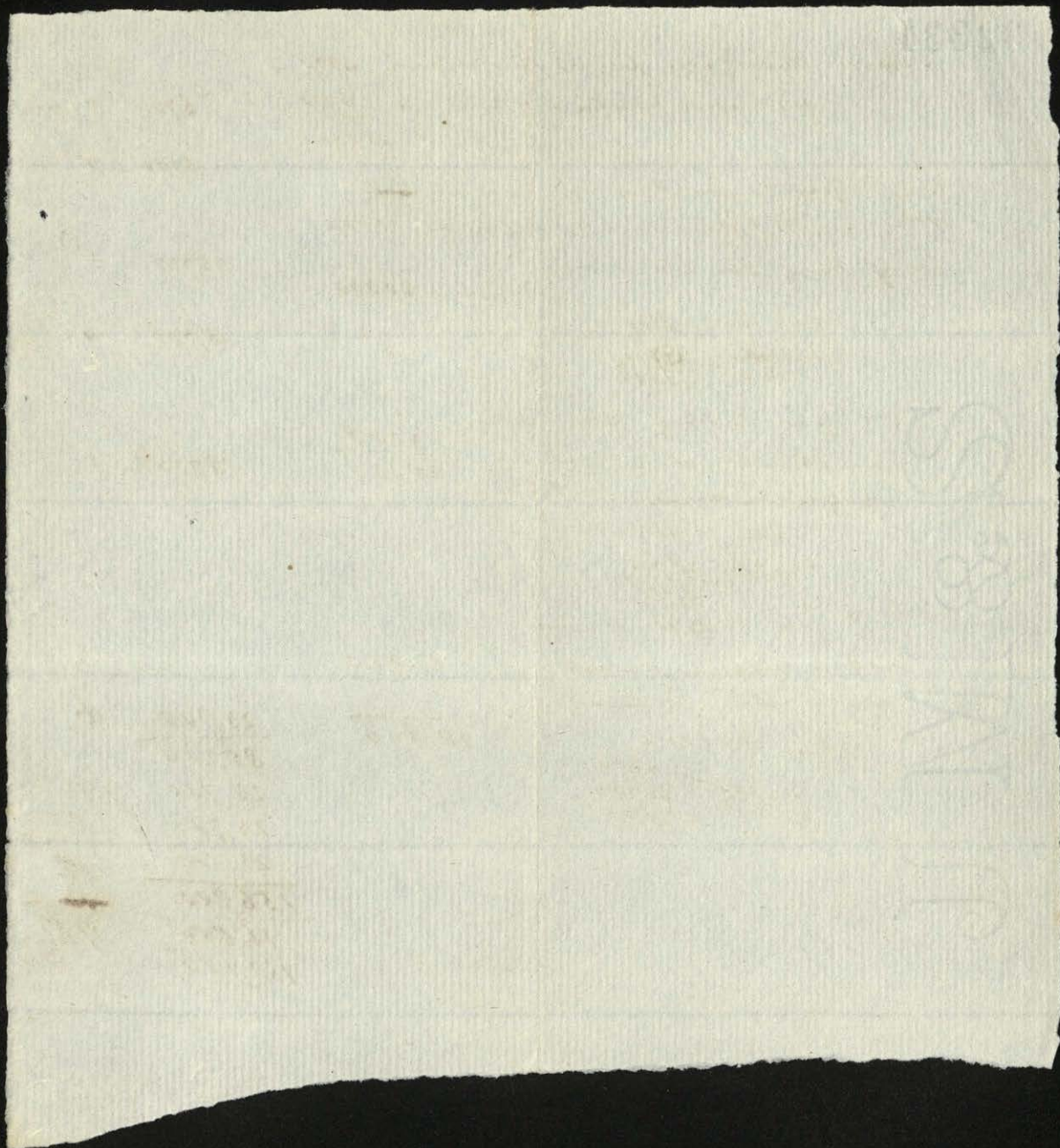
