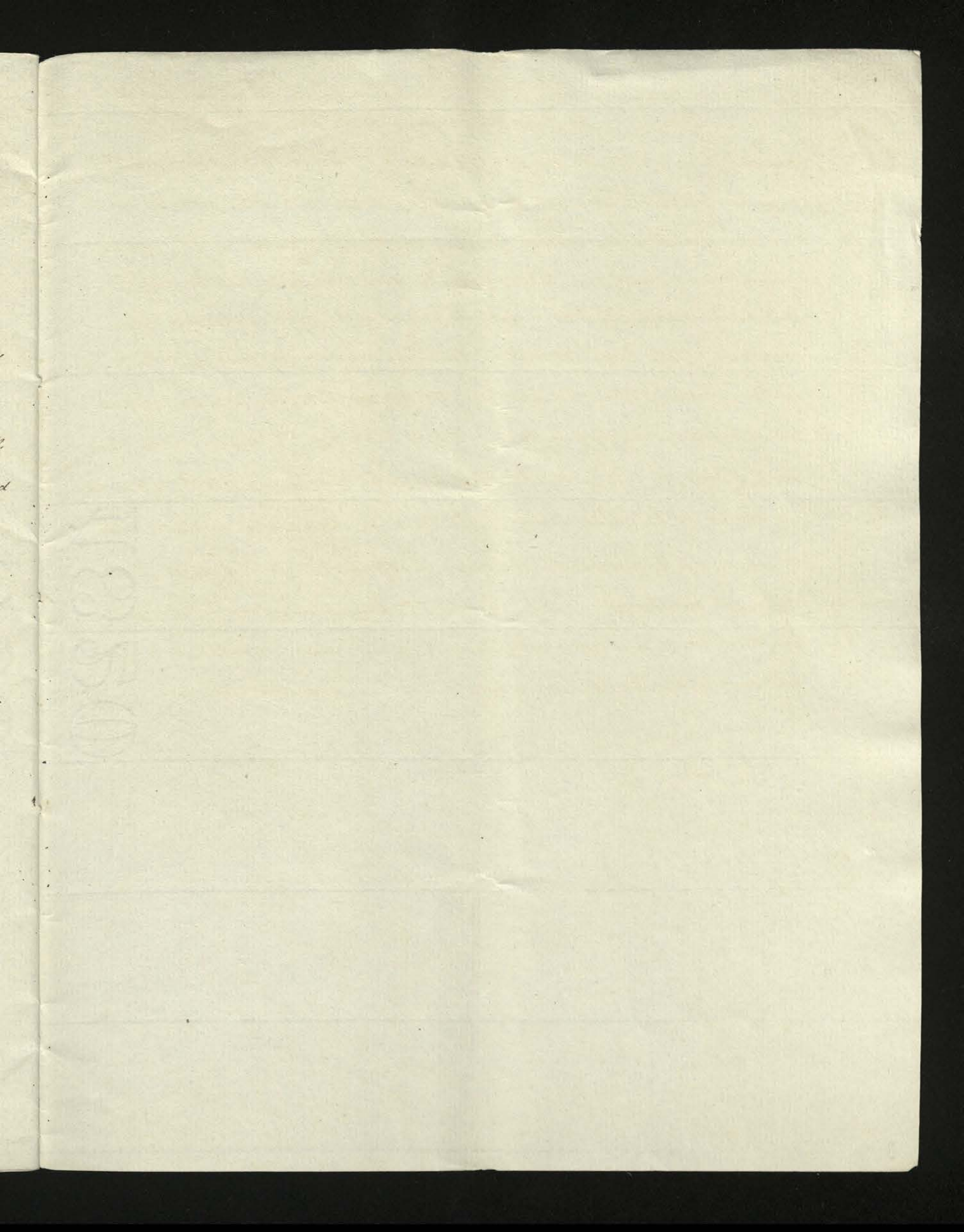

According to the Statement aforesaid, the Amount of Claims to be provided for on 20<sup>th</sup> Sept. 1822 was less, by £35,880. 6. 8, than on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of April preceding, being the difference between £121,204. 17. 11 and £85,324. 11. 3; but although much has been effected in this interval of nearly six Months, by the aid of some addition to the ordinary funds, and the avoidance of extra Expenditure, yet the progress towards the reduction of Arrears is by no means equal to the appearance thus exhibited. If Sir Benj.<sup>ts</sup> Bloomfield's final Account had continued up to the 10<sup>th</sup> of October, instead of the 19<sup>th</sup> of September, the Arrears of another Quarter would have been to be added, amounting probably to £13,000. at the least; towards which the Monthly Receipt of £5000. due 1<sup>st</sup> Oct.<sup>r</sup>, would have been applicable, thus leaving £8000. to be provided for beyond the last stated Arrears of £85,324. 11. 3. Besides this, as already before noticed, it is to be apprehended that the full extent of the Arrears is far from being yet ascertained: Mess<sup>rs</sup> Russell & Co. have delivered no Account for the last twelve Months, and many others may be equally backward: indeed, it is usual with some tradesmen to defer sending in their bills 'till after Christmas yearly.

According to the Statement aforesaid, the Amount of Claims to be provided for on 20. Sept. 1822 was less by £35,000. 6. 8 than on 3. His Majesty's Income having been found, during  
the Regency, inadequate to His Majesty's necessary expen-  
diture, and it having been so represented by the Chiefs of  
the Departments, a Sum of £20,000 was, by an Arrangement  
with His Majesty's Government on His Majesty's Accession,  
added to it, and although from Reference to the Correspondence  
which passed on the Occasion, sufficient Reasons are set forth



to prove that such addition would not sufficiently secure the Comfort of His Majesty and the Dignity of the Crown; yet as it was then thought, that it would not be advisable to make any Parliamentary alteration in the Appropriation of the Civil List, the addition referred to was accepted by His Majesty. And it cannot be considered as a Contingent Allowance, for as a Contingency His Majesty's Officers could put no Dependence in it; for it might in such Shape be the Means of creating a Debt, which ultimately it might be found, that the Treasury for paying it was withdrawn for other purposes.

It is however necessary to look at this Sum particularly with Reference to His Majesty's gracious proposal of paying back £30,000 a Year. If the £20,000 is only to be looked upon as a contingent Treasury, and not an absolute part of His Majesty's Income, His Majesty's Means will become so contracted that it will be utterly impossible to supply the Deficiency, should that Sum at any time during the five Years not be forthcoming. And in considering the £30,000 to be paid back, as so spent on His Majesty's Income, it will appear by the foregoing Statement, that the £20,000 must have been in His Majesty's Contemplation, at the time he graciously made the proposal, as a permanent part of H. M. Income.
