Windsor Castle May 12<sup>th</sup> 1830

The King having in the year 1828 expected & the Duke  
of Wellington the intention of paying to Messrs secured  
& Co the demand above stated; and H.M. having deemed  
the Duke to inform Lord Chichester that he entertained  
this intention; and having further informed Sir  
Augustus the Keeper of the Privy Purse thereof, and to

it was His Majesty's wish that this intention should  
be carried into execution in this year 1830; and  
the thing being at this time too unwell for the Duke  
or Sir D. Mynster to speak of to the King,  
The Duke and Sir D. Mynster agree that the first  
opportunity should be taken of requesting His Majesty  
to order that the unappropriated Civil List Money  
now in the Exchequer should be applied as far as it  
goes to discharge this debt
