

Sir

From the kindness and punctuality I have uniformly received from you, I feel assured you will be happy to hear that His present Majesty has been graciously pleased to continue to me the Pension of £100 on the Privy Purse, and that on the 5.<sup>th</sup> Inst. I received from M. Gen. Wheatley through Mr Bott Fifty Pounds for the Half year due that day. —

As letters to Sir William Knighton as Privy Purse, went free, and he wanted, I supposed M. Gen. Wheatley could do likewise, which error I regret, having sent to him double

Letters. — On the 1.<sup>th</sup> Inst. I wrote to you Sir, under  
Cover to that Gentleman, to Thank You for your promise  
of using your exertions with His late Majesty's  
Executors (who if I mistake not, are Sir William Knighton  
and the Duke of Wellington) to procure for me the payment  
of the Half Year due at Midsummer, <sup>1830</sup> — I have now again  
to express my best thanks to you, and to add an earnest  
hope that you will succeed with them, and that it may  
come to me through your interference, for I cannot apply  
myself. — At the same time I must acknowledge <sup>that</sup> my  
Christmas engagements were made under the full idea that in  
January there would be coming to me the usual £100 —  
were the £50 still due to me, paid, and soon it would make me  
most happy, and to use a phrase of my native land, I should  
for the remainder of my life, "go on velvet." — I have the  
Honor to be Sir, Your obliged and  Obedient Servant
