

Windsor Castle July 20 1833

My dear Sir William

I enclose a Petition from a Man, who was employed at the Coronation of His late Majesty, as Falconer, under the Duke of Arrol. You will perceive the nature of his application, and the truth of his Statement is vouched for, by Mr. Wallace, whose late I also send. It appears evident that Anderson kept the Hawks for some time at his own charge, and afterwards attended His late Majesty at Edinburgh. Under these circumstances,

concluding that the Duke of Athol alluded to
being dead, the Man has no chance of
receiving any thing from that Quarter, both
Sir Herbert & I, have thought it right, to
submit Anderson's Claim to your notice, and
should you consider him entitled to any
remuneration, you will perhaps have the
goodness to attend to him.
