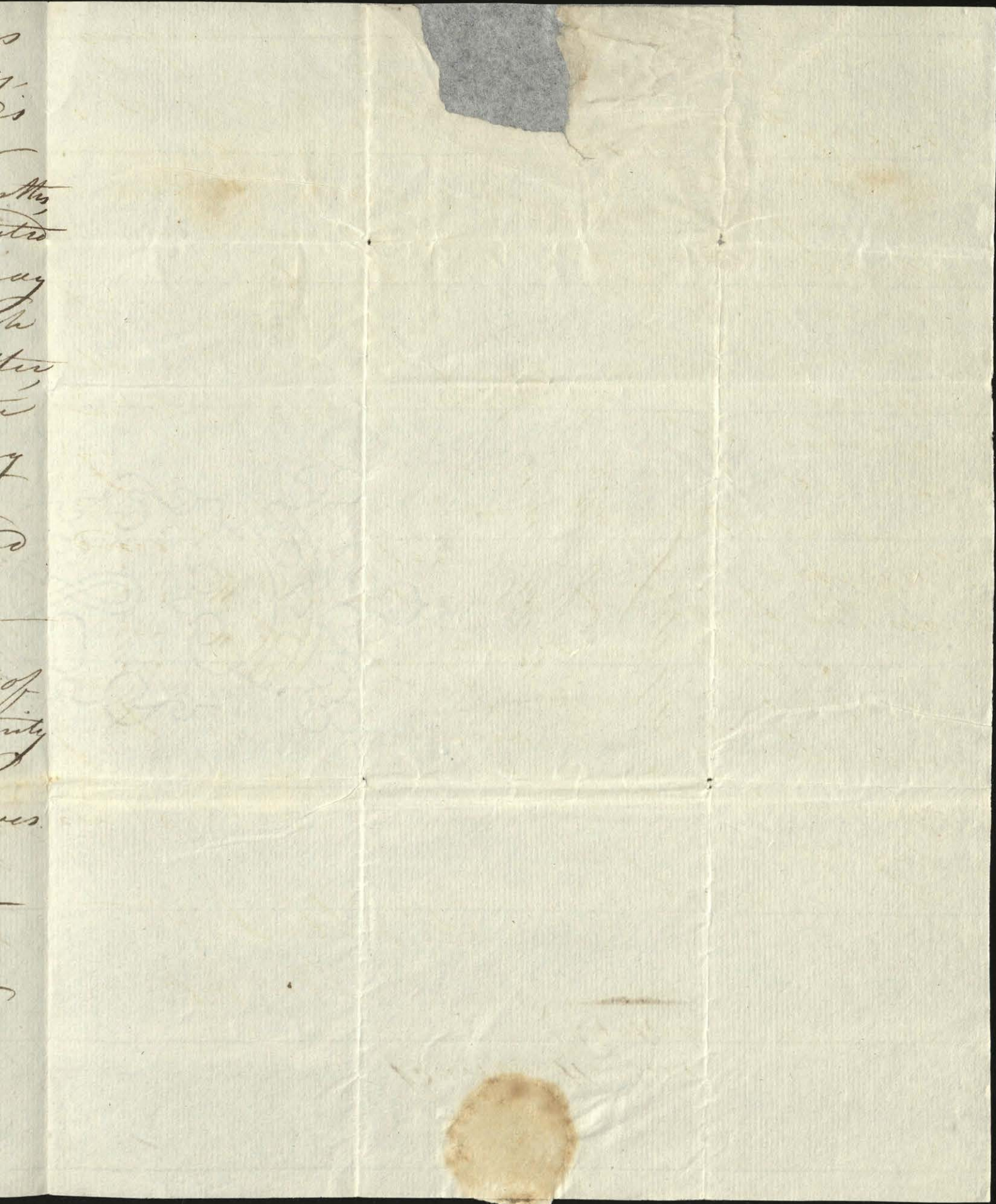
I shall be obliged to you by giving the following Instructions to the Person who has the Management of this Ale, viz. it should be placed

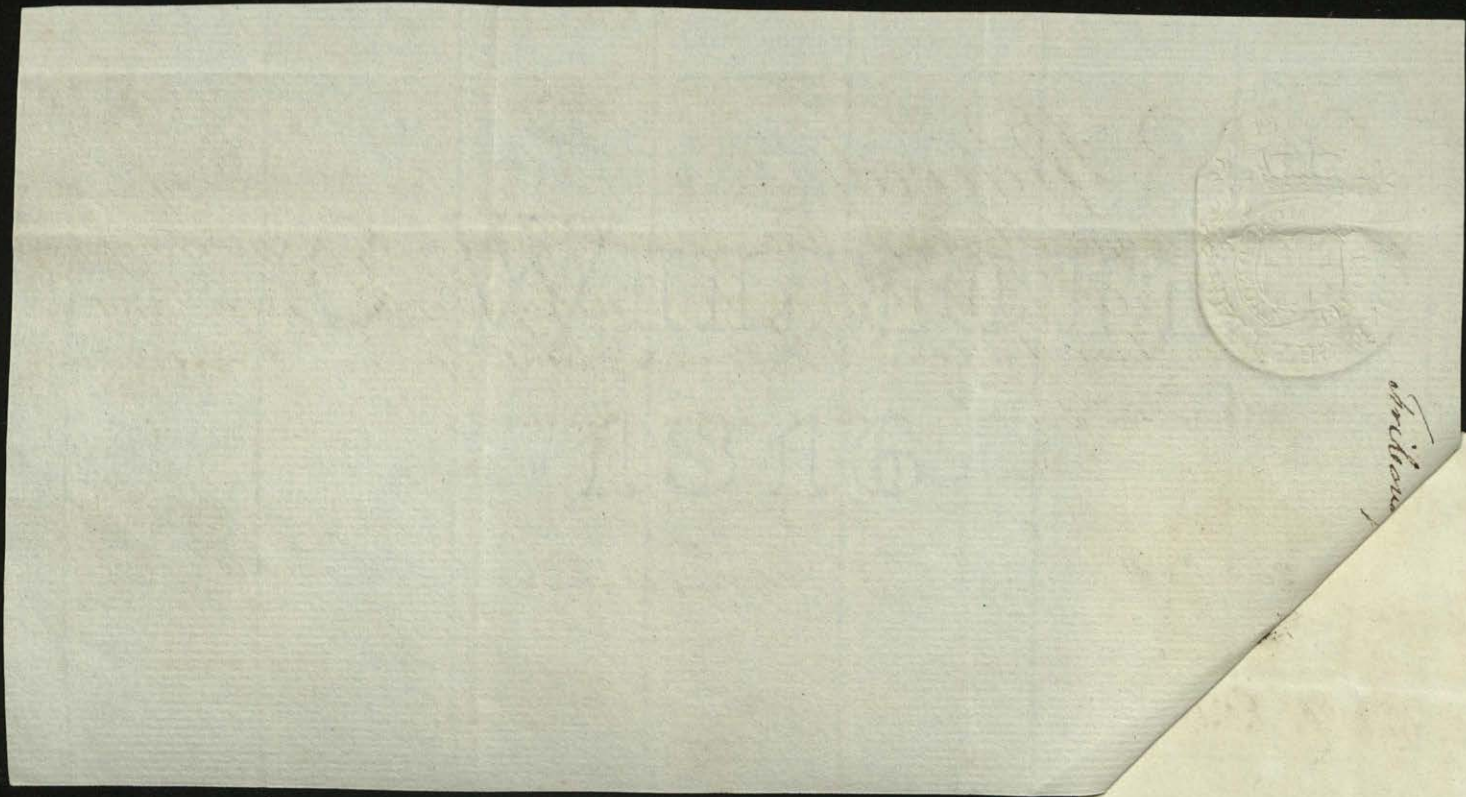

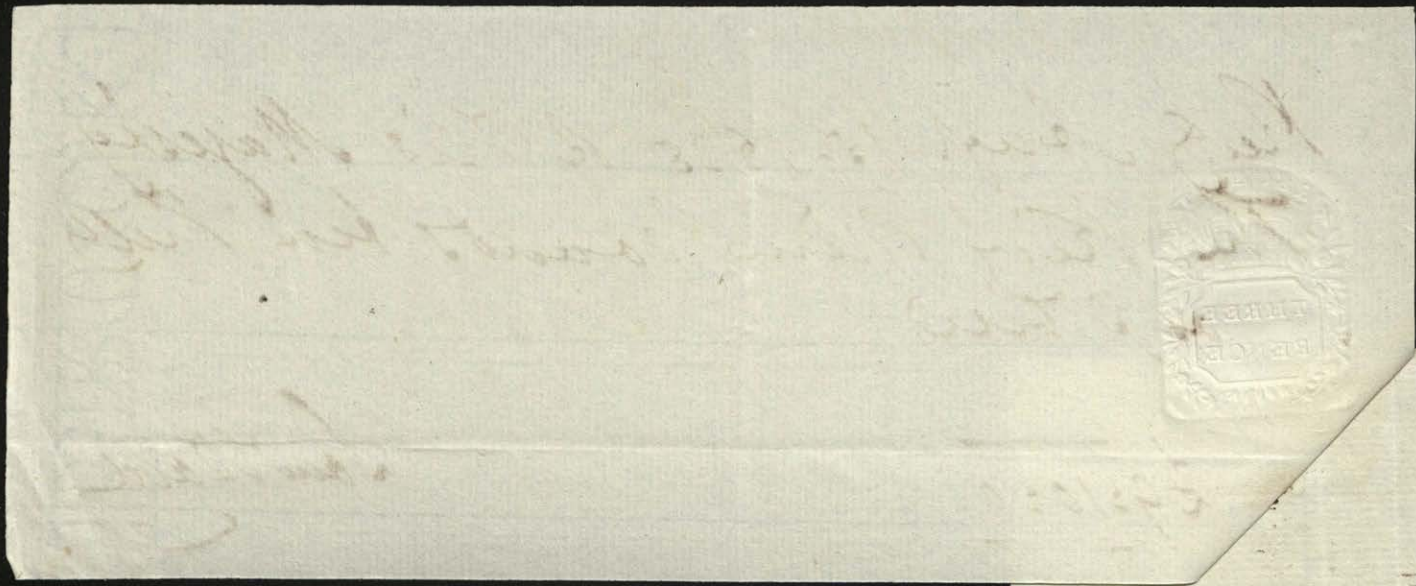
