I was surprised to find from Mr <sup>High</sup> Saunders the person of whom H. N. High purchased the House that I purchased for him of Mr Dyer that he has not been paid for the Furniture - I desired Mr Saunders (whom has the care of the Furniture) to include it in the Lady Day account & the undertaking to do so but from some mistake of his Father's it was not done & now Saunders (the owner of the Furniture) calls on me to pay the Money as I gave him my word that it should be paid to a certainty at Xmas and allow me to say that I think & I am sure you will think when you know the case that it ought somehow or other to be paid immediately - The case was this - H. N. H. rented the Ho. of H. Saunders ready furnished - Saunders had an agreement with Dyer <sup>might</sup> for a lease & also an understanding that he ~~was to~~ <sup>might</sup> purchase at a certain sum - I purchased the Ho. of Dyer without inquiring anything but that H. Saunders was a free Tenant at Will consequently the dispute as to the lease & wants have been lost. Dyer & Saunders - but the Furniture was Saunders & H. N. H. was bound to deliver back to him on the premises in the state he took it - now this was impossible for it had been changed, mixed, altered and some lost & therefore Mr H. S. might

have given us much trouble on that head & in  
my opinion obliged us to pay more than the  
value of the Furniture by the attempt at replacing  
as well as fixing the Rent perhaps in the  
meantime under this impression I found out  
the actual Value of the Furniture - I mean the  
value that it would have fetched by Auction or  
the promise and induced the Man to accept  
of this Sum viz. (I holden but as sure this from  
home I am not quite certain) £200. instead  
of near 400. as he first asked & this on my  
pledging myself to pay the Money at once -  
now under these circumstances, & in as much as  
all the rest <sup>some of which had much more than the value.</sup> had been paid I submit to you  
that Saunders ought to be paid & I would much  
rather not receive even my own account than  
<sup>that</sup> the Man whom I have induced to throw off so  
much & take no more than it would actually have  
produced him at an Auction should be left out  
of his Money - Excuse my troubling you with  
so long detail but having from I trust a good motive  
pledged myself on this occasion I am anxious  
not to forfeit it - If I should be mistaken as to  
Sum to H. Saunders I will wish to know right  
in the meantime I am &c &c
