

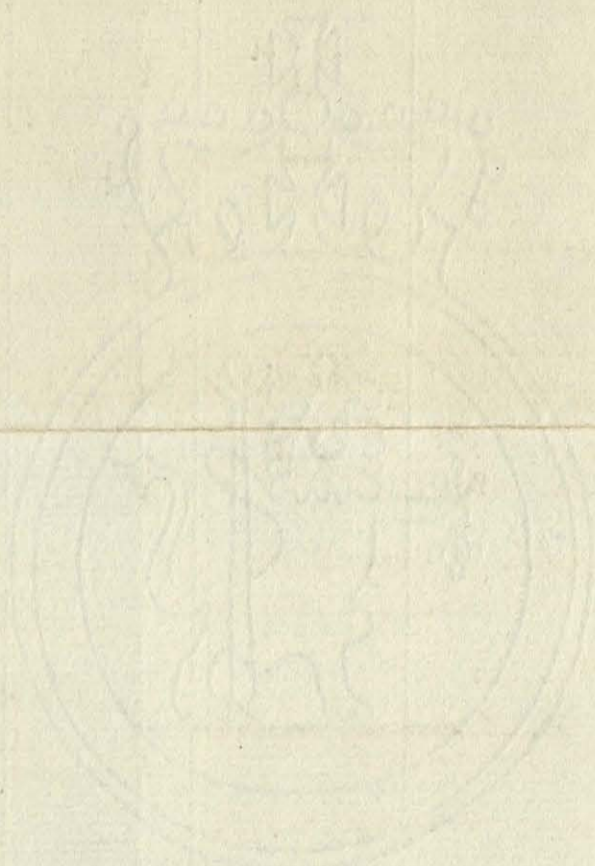

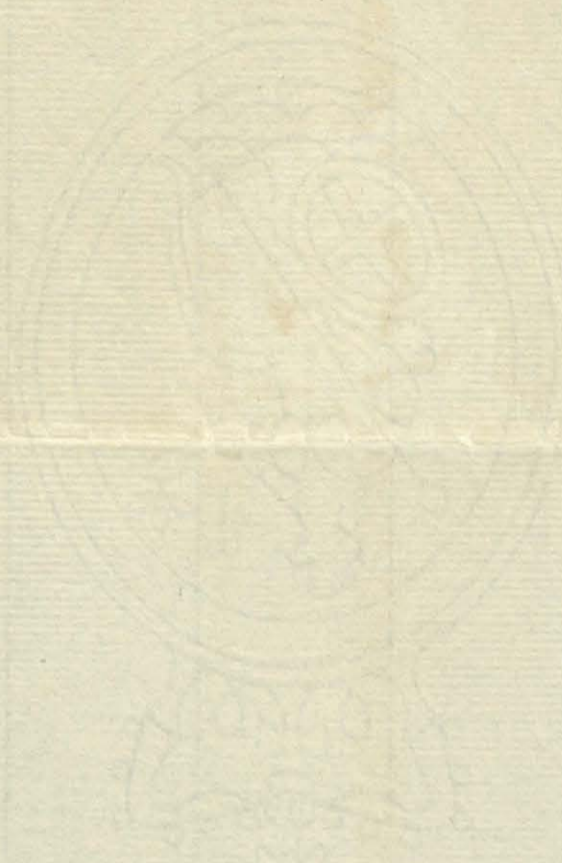

The Statement

The Statement of the Accounts thus brought under review has been delayed partly by the difficulty of understanding whether the whole of the separate Charges for Materials, Freight & Carriage, and Clerks of Works, were admissible; or whether part thereof might not be considered as included, by equivalent Charges, in the Accounts of the measured Work executed by Mr. Nash. Another difficulty occurred from there being no Account rendered of the large quantity of Old Materials arising from the various houses & other buildings taken down, great part of which has been used in the New Works. Several Certificates have been transmitted by Mr. Nash's Clerks for obviating part of these Difficulties; but further elucidation seems still necessary, and may be daily looked for.

The difficulties, here alluded to, do not apply to the Class of Bills last mentioned in the State, namely Tradesmen's Bills amounting to £80,259-7-7, wherein no additional evidence is wanting beyond a regular acknowledgment, from each Tradesman, of the receipt of the Sums stated to have been paid to them by Mr. Nash, which is expected to be soon accomplished.

If any further Advance should be required by Mr. Nash before the whole Statement can be finally balanced, it may be proper to confine the same to £4000, lest anything should arise to alter materially the present face of the Account. A much larger Sum might be advanced, supposing Mr. Nash should be allowed a % Centage for his Superintendance as an Architect; and admitting that his Accounts should altogether prove satisfactory, ~~such~~ such an Allowance seems fitting, except as to Works executed by himself, and upon which he will have the usual profit of a Tradesman; but it may perhaps be best to leave this point open until the Accounts are otherwise completely adjusted.

My dear Sir

I have been puzzling my head to comprehend how the works executed by yourself under the superintendance of Rolis, Nixon & others, amounting of State to £64,217..6..3¹/₄, should have cost £68,055..13..10¹/₂, as now set forth in your letter of 18.th instant; and this has appeared the more perplexing whenever I recurred to your early intimation respecting two Accounts for measured Carpenters work & Brickwork, together amount^g to £39,422..11..2¹/₄, from which it was proposed to deduct £2877..15..2¹/₄ as the difference between the actual Cost & the measured Value. In endeavouring to reconcile such contrarieties, it has struck me that your now stated Cost of £68,055..13..10¹/₂ covers other Items beyond those included under the head of Works by you executed, - namely £2937..13..6¹/₂ charged for Nixon & other Clerks, also a part of £1528..3..6 for Sundry Freights, which, with other Items not so readily to be pointed out, will account for the Disbursements passing thro' Nixon's hands being so much beyond the Accounts of Brickwork. Besides, you include the whole cost of £10,128..9..1¹/₂ for Timber; whereas part, amounting to £2461..19..6¹/₂, was used for Scaffolding, and stands in another Division of my last State, under the head of Materials.

The notion you have entertained from the Amount of the Works you executed, compared with your Disbursements, shows me that I have not clearly distinguished the different Heads of Expenditure; since the one

now

now in question does not embrace all the
Items connected with it, particularly the Sum
last above mentioned, & probably all others for
Materials worked up by your own people; but
my object was to bring together the charges
supposed to yield you the ordinary profit, amongst
which it did not occur to me to include the
Scaffolding. I will not, however, dwell longer
on this point, having said enough, I trust, to
lead you to such a revision of it as may
wholly remove the impurification which
you wrote.

I had an opportunity on Monday
last of mentioning to Sir Benj^r. Bloomfield
that I believed it would be an accommodation
to you to receive the allowance for Commission
at the time of settling the balance; and that
you was desirous of immediately receiving the
Sums deducted from different Bills as payable
by the Lord Chamberlain. His Answer was
that the Commission was the last thing to be
settled & must at present wait; and that as to
the Sums due from the Lord Chamberlain, he wd.
readily assist in any application to that Depart^{mt};
thinking every endeavour necessary before he
undertook to advance the amount on His Majesty's
behalf. You will thus perceive that the balance
of £6771. 12. 6^p is the utmost you have just
now to look for, and there is reason to fear
it may not all come forth in one Sum;
but you may rely on my exertions to procure
the whole of it for you early in next month,
& to get all else adjusted as soon after as possible,
for you can scarcely be more anxious to receive
the

The Money than I am to get these Accounts completely out of my hands: they have been a sore plague to a being who has only a very short time in each day when he is capable of entering on such subjects.

If you would direct regular Bills to be made out, and forwarded hither of the Works to be paid for by the Lord Chamberlain I could put them in the hands of Sir Benjamin Bloomfield for his introduction of them: by this course, if he should not succeed, he will more readily see the propriety of payment
