Mr Roberts & Mr & Miss Sutherland, have executed the Release to Sir Samr. Thelme, which Mr Roberts now brings with him to — exchange for the produce of the two thirds of the Stock — As the Deed expresses the money "to have been paid" immediately upon the Sale, to Mr Roberts and by him divided between Mr & Miss Sutherland prior to the Execution of the Release, which all of them thereby acknowledge, a Receipt by Roberts indorsed on the Deed, would be I think unnecessary, and indeed inconsistent, and it is therefore omitted — The Draft of Mr Roberts' proposed Affidavit, verifying the pedigree of the Sutherlands, and which was forwarded to you with the Certificates, can after being sworn to by Mr Roberts at the time

he receives the money, which with the
Certificates will of course remain in your
possession

On referring to the abstract I find
that the London money paid by His Majesty, is set
forth in the Surrender to Sir Saund' Hulst, and the
property is expressed to be Surrendered in London
of the payment of it, ^{Amount of} the Surrender must therefore
have borne the proper ad Valorem Duty.

Some Difference seems to exist as to
the payment of the Expenses attending the Release,
Mr Atter is of opinion that they must be paid
out of the trust money, but Mr Hobbs conceives that
all Expenses attending the transaction, ought to be
