If his Majesty would dismiss Ld
North, he does not suppose that
any of the Arrangements proposed
should take place. He mentioned
them because it was his duty, &
because the places must be filled

them himself, nor as thinking they

to Government. Lord North hopes
that his Majesty will not think
it unbecoming in Lord North to
renew at the close of a Session a
request which he has made every
year since he has been in office.
especially, as he puts himself forward

situation, which, he is convinced, is to be
