Lord North has the honor of informing
his Majesty, that the House of
Commons has passed the amended
Military Bill, & that there will
be no difficulty or objection to his
Majesty's proroguing Parliament
tomorrow; as no more Bills
remain to be passed, it is
probable that the Members

will make no speech to his Majesty
on the Throne. There were two
Divisions in the course of the
day, both upon points of order,
& upon questions whether the
Lords were competent to make
the amendments to the Bill that
was made. The numbers on each
division were as follows
