Lord North has the honour of sending
his Majesty a letter he has received

for his Majesty's signature if approved
as this election, & the grant of the Steward-
ship is likely to be disputed, Lord North

thinks it more safe that the appointment
should be by His Majesty, as it will
then be out of doubt a sufficient time
for vacating Mr. Jaffnell's seat.

Lord North expects every minute a

with a proposal for supporting Mr
Jaffnell with some money from the Civil
List if necessary, but Lord North will
not engage to give any for the support of
