I cannot say the letter from the Lord Lieutenant of
Ireland contains much information, except that of his
desire to conform himself to such directions as He may
receiv from hence, which is I am sorry to say the first
time he has shew'd such an inclination. The late
Mr. Grenville us'd whenever a contest was expected
to follow the mode propos'd on the present
occasion by Lord North, namely prepare the Warrant
for my signature instead of that of the Treasury.
If the D. of Northumberland requires some gold
pills for the Election it would be wrong not to give
him some assistance.
