Your Majesty will find some few alterations in the Ist to the Empress of Russia upon further Reflexion it appeared some improper to refer to the Interview with the Empress as that Interview was kept secret from et Paris who some time or other will be acquainted with yr Majesty's Letter I thought too so that the Compliment at the end with respect to the Impl<sup>d</sup> Majesty's Intervention was conceived in Terms that if known would displeas at Vienna and were not strictly conformable to the Language held at that Court. Such of the Dispatches as I have marked to have been

been read at the Cabinet were approved  
there. The Private and <sup>most</sup> Confidential were  
not read there. The sum mentioned  
in the Private Letter was what appeared  
reasonable to Lord North considering the peculiar  
circumstances of Mr. Morris's situation and  
the extra<sup>n</sup> expense he had been forced  
to incur.

The Meeting broke up too late to trouble  
Your Majesty with the Dispatches to Hugh  
but they will be sent early tomorrow  
and if Your Majesty approves it is proposed  
that Mr. Morris <sup>should</sup> be redispached  
tomorrow evening.
