- May 1. 1834 To Sir Herbert
Pascoe
In answer to the
Inquiry made by
desire of H. M.
whether any aid
is necessary to
the Rules Dept
this year
That I do not anticipate
any such necessity
- May 9 " To Sir Thomas Lethbridge
In answer to his
application to
wear the King's
Private uniform
That His Majesty has
laid down a Rule upon
the subject, which prevents
his being allowed that
privilege without an
impediment of the course
adopted towards many
similar applications

In answer to a
letter desiring I
would express to
the King his
undiminished
loyalty —
That the nature of the
Rule I had named to
him, and H. M. observation
upon it with reference to
himself made any
further communication

That H. M. desires a

Captains in the Army

- July 29 1834 Vis Duncan That I had received His
 Secy of State Home Dpt —
 Proprietor's permission for my
 carriage to pass thro' the Parks
 during the time I was Master
 of the Parks, & being requested
 he would add my name to
 the list of those who had
 that permission
- Oct 24 " Sir Tho Hardy
 Admiralty
 That the King desires to
 know the character of
 Sergeant Jas Secher to the
 who received Lord Nelson
 in his arms when he fell
 wounded at Trafalgar &
 his fitness to be appointed
 one of the yeomen of his Guard
- " Sir Robert Taylor To a general Rm
 Secher is 54 years of age
 5 feet 6 in height well
 built & soldier like in
 appearance & of irreproachable
 character to the present day
- November 19 Sir R G Benthley
 in answer
 That the name of the person
 the King promised to make

 is James Secher
- Nov 19 — The Duke of
 Grafton
 That Rm would name
 him at 11 in the forenoon
 the following day, but that
 His grace's invitation of
 the Garter would be made
 on another occasion

 That the King wished the
 late Duke of Gloucester
 Henschold to wear their
 uniforms at Rm's
 Funeral
