Richmond House 29 Feb
1766

Gen. Conway's most humble duty waits on his Majesty: it has
taken the liberty of informing his Majesty that the Committee sat till
past Two this morning which prevented his acquainting his M. sooner
with what passed - the Question for the Repeal of the Stamp act was
carried by a majority of 108 - the Numbers being 275 to 167 -

The Debate began late on account of the reading some Letters &
a discussion concerning some supposed News from America. -

The Debate was not animated as generally happens upon the most
important Subjects, when they have been long the subject of discussion &
are treated upon a National footing as was the case last night.

G. C. has enclosed a list of the Speakers which as his Majesty
sees are but few.

The Duke of Richmond arrived yesterday & will pay his Duty
to his Majesty the first proper moment.
