versation on the Kings Birth Day about the Unfor-
tunate Mrs/ Hesse. I have look'd & find that the Pro-
mise was not made to the Now living Sister of Mrs,
Chetwin, but to Her that is Dead. That being the case
She can surely not be in the way of any Body, but
the King from the beginning of my coming to England
having desired me to keep every Place in my Family, as near
to the Bank in which I found it, must of course pre-
clude the Person in question. I hope my Sincerity will
~~be~~ ~~with~~ meet with Your approbation & not
be imputed to any dislike of mine towards the Unfor-
tunate Widow whose Distress no Body pitie's more
Sincerely than I do.

I hope Your return to Town on Tuesday was

not attended with any bad accident or great Fatigue
the latter I feared much on account of the Violence
of the Heat.
