My dearest Son. I have waited till to Day  
in hopes of being able to say something  
Comfortable, but I am sorry to say that I  
know of Nothing that has past since Wednes-  
day last when at the V<sup>gs</sup> return I told him  
of Y<sup>r</sup> Visit, & ~~part~~ part of Our Conversa-  
tion, particularly the disagreeable Situation  
of Affairs. He then assured me of not having  
received any Letter from Bro Thurlow, I expec-  
ted to hear something about it on Friday  
when He came from Turin, but not a Word  
has pass'd since. I must however add that  
the L<sup>d</sup> heard me without being angry as  
far as Time would permit me to Speak, but  
gave no answer, only saying he had received  
no ~~answer~~ Letter. I am sorry I can give no



better account, yet such as it is. I thought  
You should know it, the 12<sup>th</sup> I think  
it might be mentioned is ignorant of  
my writing to You. God knows if  
my good wishes could make You easy  
You would be so, before this reaches You  
I wish I had the means also, but as  
that fails You must be satisfied with  
the good wishes of  
the 12<sup>th</sup> of July. Yr most affectionate
