My dearest Son. The contents of Y^r letter ~~that~~ I received this Morning early, were known to me last Night as the King upon opening His Letters mentioned the Request Ernest had made to go to Hannover & Brunsvic with Prince William. He said it was what He would not grant ~~was~~ got up to answer it immediately saying that the Army was the only Place where an Officer ought to remain particularly when He commands a Regiment. that being the Case I hope You are aware that the present Moment would be proper to interfere whatever I may feel upon the Subject.

Inclosed I send a Letter from Mrs Scott. & having done that give me leave to speak the Truth upon Her Subject. — She is a Person who in my opinion will by no means Answer Y^r Purpose

She is Naturally meddling, & too exigent, &
Now 33 Years Advanced in Age which of Course
will not have increased Her Strength, but by
living so much alone may have rendered Her per-
haps still more Difficult to deal with than before
& Her first & last Word Always was in every
Allocation. I am a Scott & belong to the Queen
Family. They pardon for having Spoken so
openly upon this Subject, but as I suppose you
mean the Housekeeper to do the Duty of Her Place
I never could advise You to take a Gentlewoman

I hope to have the pleasure of seeing You
to Morrow which I long for very much
& am my dearest Son
